Dear Parish Family,

Last week I informed you of the parish's intention to assist the Alpha School in accommodating the increase in their student body. The Alpha School has a very good reputation in specialized student education. Their move to our location has assisted them in flourishing, and in turn, helping the special needs student population to flourish. This is a wonderful development, and necessitated an increase in square footage. Several months ago the parent company, RKS, approached us about expanding into the B Wing classrooms. The only way for this to happen would be to renovate two large rooms used as offices for the pastor and parochial vicar in the A Wing. These offices would be divided into multiple office and conference space for the parish office operations. Since this was feasible, and their staff is capable of completing the transformation, we moved forward.

In September, the Religious Education Offices will move into the A Wing. The parochial vicar's office will be converted into 2 offices: a shared office for the Religious Education Secretary, and the Sacramental Coordinator, and one office for the Parish Catechetical Leader/DRE; the remaining space will be a general use meeting room.

The pastor's office will be renovated sometime in the fall into three spaces: an office for the pastor, an office for the parochial vicar, and an office for the Director of Sacred Music. Gonzaga Hall has two enclosed rooms: one will be a youth room, and the other, a general use meeting room. Inside the open space of Gonzaga Hall, we will install 10 Screenflex dividers, which will form 4 rooms (with doors) for general meeting space, and allows us to fold them away if we need to use the whole room for an event.

All of this will cause some disruption, particularly the construction in the A Wing, and I ask for your patience as this project will be ongoing into the fall. These changes benefit the Alpha School's expansion, and the needs of the parish administration, as well as the many parish groups that meet regularly.

Friday, June 21st on the Feast of St. Aloysius, we had a wonderful celebration of the Parish's 60th Anniversary. In some ways it was a little bitter sweet. On Wednesday, we buried a 30-year member of the parish, Debbie Flynn, and Monday, June 17th, one of the founding members (60 year member) of the parish passed to the House of the Father, Eileen Malter, whose funeral was Saturday. Pray for the repose of their souls, they were great women of faith who built community in the parish.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of

death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.






Parish Counseling Services Are Available.


