Dear Parish Family-

On this last Sunday in June, we bid farewell to Fr. Jim Smith, our Parochial Vicar of five years; hard to believe it has been five years since we received a newly ordained priest, now he goes off as a seasoned priest assuming his own Pastorate at St. Isaac Jogues Church in Evesham Township. If you wonder where that is, it is in Burlington County between Voorhees and Mount Laurel. When I was newly ordained, there were 126 parishes in the Diocese, several years later the Bishop announced the erection of a 127th parish, St. Isaac Jogues in Evesham. Today, by contrast, we have 97 parishes but St. Isaac's is still there! If you visit him there, and have been to St. Mary in New Monmouth, you will recognize the architectural style as both Churches shared the same architect, St. Isaac's being the first of the two built.

There is a reception after his personal 12 noon 'Solemn Mass' in Morello Hall, please come out to wish him well. FYI, beginning in July there will be no 12 noon Solemn Mass. Masses will be the regular parish scheduled Masses of Sat 5pm, Sun 7am, 8:30am and 10:30am.

Fr. Jim Smith came to us a newly ordained priest with great enthusiasm, devotion and dedication. Those qualities never faded and only grew stronger. He had a keen interest in technology which he was able to put to full use during the pandemic and which greatly benefited the parish. He has great interest in the bible and has maintained a wonderful bible study during his five years. He enjoyed interacting with the RCIA and our Religious Education Program. He was a great resource for our Religious Education Team. His love for liturgy was apparent from his first week here and that developed into his 'Solemn Mass' at its own time and which I am sure he will carry with him to St. Isaac's.

Speaking personally, he was a good brother priest, he was easy to live with and we enjoyed many conversations over the years. Plus, he is a terrific sour dough bread baker, sometimes I thought we were running a Monastery Bakery! He learned the art of pizza making from me and far excelled my abilities, most Fridays we enjoyed homemade pizza and some Sundays too! We all wish him well as he goes forth to preach the word and as the Code of Canon Law directs the Pastor: to Teach, to Govern and to Sanctify. Speaking from long experience, the Teaching part comes easy, the Sanctify part is a little harder and the Governing part is the most difficult. The First Pastorate experience is a very exciting one for a priest. Being a pastor is not always easy, but it is always fulfilling. I am very happy for Fr. Jim Smith, sad he is leaving, but overjoyed he is becoming a pastor. I wish him well, many blessings and happiness. Ad Multos Annos, Vivat!!

And so, it is with an open heart and mind that I embrace the future, but will always look lovingly on the people whose prayers, support, laughter, and tears, made me the priest I am today. This is not goodbye, but a fond farewell. And if you are ever near Marlton, you have a friend at St. Isaac Jogues.




The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** used to be called “the Last Rites” or “Extreme Unction” because the usual recipient was a dying person. This sacrament is also offered for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. Please do not wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. If you or a family member would like the Anointing of the Sick, please contact the parish office.




