Dear Parish Family-


Last Sunday we celebrated the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, formerly called Corpus Christi, the Second Vatican Council called the Most Holy Eucharist “The Source and Summit” of the Christian Life. All the Ministries and charitable works should usher forth from the Mass and return to it. The Council desired a full active participation of all the faithful in the Celebration of the Mass, the Lord’s Supper. This means full participation in the prayers, singing, signs and gestures of the Mass.

Last Sunday also marked the Diocesan Phase of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops three year ‘Eucharistic Revival’; a period of study, devotion, reflection and prayer on the importance of the Eucharist in the life of each believer.

Our Bishop asked all the parishes to have a Eucharistic Procession after one of the weekend Masses. We held ours at the end of the 12 noon Mass. I provided an antique Eucharistic Canopy for the procession however it lacked poles so Fr. Jim made a set of poles to fit the Canopy. It was a beautiful day and it was a beautiful procession from the New Church, around the perimeter of the parking lot while a First Communicant, Julianne in her white dress, tossed flower petals before the Blessed Sacrament and ending with adoration in Gonzaga Hall. This had echoes of our Holy Thursday Procession from the New Church to Gonzaga Hall thus tying the festivities to the Solemnity of the Lord’s Supper during Holy Week.

Sadly last week our Bishop David M. O’Connell became gravely ill on Thursday with complications from a blood infection, he made a direct appeal to the Clergy and people of the Diocese to pray for his recovery. On Monday the Bishop sent out an update thanking all the faithful for their prayers during his difficult health scare. He was discharged from the hospital on Sunday, sent home for rest and recovery. He thanks everyone for their prayers, good wishes and thoughts. They sustained him and he was not alone but had the support of our Diocesan family.
