Dear Fellow Parishioners,

I apologize for the mix-up. Two bulletins ago, I said last Sunday's column would be given over to Jen Petrillo to speak about infertility; that will be in the July 20th bulletin. When you have too many things to think about, they sometimes get scrambled in your brain like eggs!

Last Sunday's bulletin letter space was dedicated to the upcoming anniversary of Bishop O'Connell. The Diocese of Trenton is asking everyone to make a Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy spiritual bouquet for the Bishop on the occasion of his anniversary.

This Sunday at the 8:30am Mass, Jen Petrillo and I will present the Diocesan St. Stephen Award on behalf of Bishop O'Connell to Catherine Prioli. This award is presented to members of parish youth organizations for outstanding faithful service and witness. Catherine has been an active member of our AYM Youth Group for many years. She is a dedicated Catholic youth on fire for Jesus, and we are thrilled to be able to present her with this award on behalf of the Bishop. Congratulations to Catherine on this most deserving occasion!

As you know, May, also October, is a month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the following month, June, is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Devotion to the Sacred Heart goes back centuries and is even mentioned by the Fathers of the Church, particularly St. Justin the Martyr. Devotion to the Sacred Heart evolved from devotions to the five wounds of Jesus on the Cross starting in the 7th Century. By the 12th Century, these meditations began to focus on the wound created by the centurion who thrust his spear into the heart of Jesus, and blood and water flowed out owing to the preaching of St. Bernard of Clairvaux and St. Anselm, the personal devotion of St. Francis of Assisi and St. Gertrude the Great as well as St. Mechtild. The devotion culminated in the revelations given by Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alaquoque between 1673 and 1675. This year marks the 350th anniversary of these revelations. Jesus told St. Margaret Mary the Eucharist was the "Sacrament of Love," thus linking his sacred heart to the Eucharist. Therefore, the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was placed on the Friday following the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Jesus (Corpus Christi).

In our tumultuous age, we should seek refuge in the heart of Jesus. When we are born, the doctor places us on our mother's chest, where we once again hear the assuring beat of our mother's heart we heard intimately in the womb. When animals are rescued at an early age without their mother, a clock is often placed near them as a reassuring replacement for their mother's heart. The heart is the center of our souls; it is there, Jesus seeks to speak to us as the Venerable Fulton Sheen said, "heart speaks to heart." There, we hear the reassuring beat of the savior's love for us. We might all endeavor to pick up the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the reassuring beat of his heart for us. In the Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano, medicine, and science found the bleeding host to have cardiac material. Jesus wishes to draw us to his own heart and conform the beating of our hearts to his heart. As we come to the end of June, the month of the Sacred Heart, I invite you to discover, or rediscover, the devotion to Christ's five wounds, and particularly the Sacred Heart of Jesus whose love beats for you.



In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
