Dear Parish Family,

This Thursday, our nation will celebrate the 248th Anniversary of its independence, when on July 2, 1776, the Continental Congress, meeting in secret in Carpenter's Hall in Philadelphia, representing 13 English Colonies, voted unanimously to form a "more perfect union". On July 4, 1776, after the representative from Pennsylvania, Mr. Benjamin Franklin, had completed printing the broadsheets, the Declaration of Independence was read aloud to the populace for the first time.

Someone would later ask Mr. John Adams, the representative from the Colony of Massachusetts, "What kind of government was formed?" he responded, "A Republic, if you can keep it." And, that has been the challenge from the very start. Being a free people is a messy business, a cantankerous business, and a difficult business. Let's face it most people prefer to be told what to do by someone else; that way you take no responsibility for the outcome. Liberty requires that *everyone* take a stand and contribute. Politicians today prefer a populace who simply do what they are told without knowledge or contribution.

Liberty requires work, struggle, and in most cases, compromise. Possibly, like no other time in our history, do we struggle to keep a republic. There is a strong push for the nation to discard the republic in favor of socialism (communism with a more palatable name). Our elites, media and university intellectuals tell us 24/7 how precious, and superior socialism is to our form of government. Socialism has been a big hit in South America, after all, just look at the success in Venezuela, a country rich in resources and in collapse!!! Our political, communication, elites and university intellectuals would have us believe that abject failure is actually success! Why? In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of

death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.


