Dear Parish Family-



Happy Fourth of July, Independence Day!! I hope you have a great celebration of all things American! We live in the greatest Country on earth. I know I am grateful to God to have been born here and be an American Citizen. While our nation is not perfect we are always striving for a more perfect union. That struggle has been with us since the first Fourth of July. "We hold these truths to be self-evident" the founder wrote but they did not enunciate those truths and even they knew all those truths were far from self-evident. It falls to each generation to discern and proclaim those truths.

This year we received an early birthday present in the overturning of Roe vs. Wade. While today many of the woke claim our Supreme Court is political and engaged in social engineering, this is far from reality and truth. When the 9 Justices on January 22, 1973 decided Roe vs. Wade they were engaging in political action by judicial fiat and promoting social engineering. They found what cannot be found in the plain reading of the text of the Constitution. Nowhere in the text can you find an explicit or implicit reference to Abortion. There is an old principle that says, "Error has no rights" and today's Supreme Court has overturned a bad and erroneous decision. Changing the Federal Law on Abortion however does not change hearts. There is still much work to be done on the teaching of the dignity of the human person from conception to natural death. There is still much work to be done to support those who consider their pregnancy a crisis situation. Many factors lead a person to chose Abortion, many times no support from the other parent, no family support, poor financial condition and so many other reasons, even ignorance about the life they carry because our media tells them it is just a piece of tissue, like a tumor, that should be eradicated.

We need as Christian to work hard to find ways to support people who seek abortions, to help them to choose life and not death for their unborn baby. Children bring joy to our lives, they are our future. President Kennedy said, "Children are our greatest national resource and the best hope for our future".

After the Roe Decision on Friday June 24 all the parishes received a direct communication from our Bishop from Federal Law Enforcement that several Anarchist groups had planned a "Night of Rage" specifically targeting Catholic Churches. Their leadership called for the burning, bombing and destruction of Catholic Churches nationwide, including the murder of Catholic Priests. The Bishop asked us to contact local law enforcement and to keep our lights on overnight from Friday night to Saturday Morning. He also asked priests to be extra cautious of our surroundings. Thankfully we had peace here and the great support of the Jackson Police Department.

Last week the Parish sponsored a week long Icon Painting Workshop taught by Theodoros Papadopoulos, a Greek Master Iconographer who works in the Byzantine Style. We had beginners, intermediate and experience Iconographers, those who never painted an icon, those who never painted, those who cannot even draw a straight line (like me!) and all of them had a great experience and took home a beautiful hand painted Icon of the Mother of God with Child.

Finally, on a more pleasant note, mark your calendars for Saturday August 6 after the 5pm Mass we will have a wine and cheese reception for Msgr. Joe. Msgr. Joe celebrated two milestones in his life this year, his 85th birthday and his 60th Anniversary as a priest. We would like to show our appreciation and share in his joy in this special year.

Traditional Mass Catechesis by Fr. Jim
Mass is Petition

Previously, I wrote about the Mass as ***adoration and thanksgiving***. The Mass is also ***petition***. Through Christ's intercession, we hope to obtain the assistance of God's grace for our intentions. The definition of prayer is a ***fervent petition***. We all have certain needs, both physically and spiritually. We place our needs in the form of ***petition*** at the foot of the altar and offer them to Christ, who then offers them to the Father, as He offered Himself on the Cross.

In Psalm 141 we read: "LORD, I call to you; hasten to me; listen to my plea when I call." Do we not also petition God in this way? And by so doing, do we not predispose ourselves, then, to receive His grace according to His Divine and Holy Will? The Mass is our greatest prayer, there is no greater way to make our ***petitions*** known to God than in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
