Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Happy 249th Birthday to the United States of America!!! What a ride it has been! What a way we have yet to travel! The business of Freedom is always a project under construction!

Our age seems to be a divided age where some want to see the Nation develop into a Socialist republic, which seems to me only to benefit the Oligarchy, the wealthy, and the powerful while falsely promising a utopia for the masses. I was humored by the “no kings” rallies railing against President Trump while his opponents were all shouting, “I am a Senator,” “I am a member of the House of Representatives,” or “I am a mayor,” while disrupting and interfering with Law Enforcement. These politicians call Trump a “king” who they claim wants to be above the law, while they shout at law enforcement; they are above the law because of the political office they hold!

Whatever your politics, these charades are all kabuki theatre! It seems that at times, we are devolving into a parliamentary form of Government that is often circus-like. We can look to our Constitution for all our trouble and confusion, which seems to be under attack from both sides! Each of us has a responsibility to sustain the Republic, to be the glue that binds the Nation and the healing salve that cures the wounds we self-inflict. I am offended by Politicians who find time to grandstand and make spectacles for their bases while failing at every turn to overhaul our immigration system. The problem lies with a Congress that refuses to act lest they offend some member or members of their base. How about doing it for the good of the Nation? We need immigrants; all of us are descendants of Immigrants; we are here as proud Americans because someone bravely and with courage left something less to gain something more, to live freely and prosper! Let’s have a meaningful overhaul of our immigration laws to benefit those who wish to join the great American Experiment and those who already live in this great experiment we call America! It is time for politicians to rediscover the meaning of the words “For the people.” it sounds familiar; the Founders used it in the preamble of the Constitution, and every American knows the words “We the People”.

Happy Fourth of July on this 249th Anniversary of the Republic...Let us endeavor to keep it!!!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic “who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age”. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person’s illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.






