Dear Parish Family-

Our parish Youth Group does several community oriented service projects a year. In the weeks before Father's Day they made and sent Father's Day cards to each of the retired priests living at Villa Vianney, our Priest Retirement Home in Lawrenceville.

Last week I received a note of thank you from the Priest Delegate, Msgr. John K. Dermond, thanking the parish on behalf of all the retired priests at the Villa Vianney:


The Holy See released this statement: "The theme chosen by the Holy Father for the occasion is *"In old age they will still bear fruit"* (Psalm 92:15) and intends to emphasize how grandparents and the elderly are a value and a gift both for society and for ecclesial communities.

I recall with immense joy my own grandparents, all four of them, whom I was not only blessed to know but also blessed to live with, including one great-grandmother! Every weekend and most of the summer we spent with my paternal grandparents who lived near the bay where myself and my cousin could pass the day fishing, crabbing and getting into mischief in the marshes, not to mention eating a lot of French fries from the fishery. We often 'caught' my grandfather drinking beer watching the water and he would bribe us with a few bucks to get French fries in exchange for our silence! LOL

My maternal grandmother and great-grandmother lived with us. They spoke Italian as my great-grandmother was from Potenza and my great-grandfather from Apulia. My childhood was filled with fun and spoiling by all my grandparents. My own father, who just went to the Lord in April, loved and adored being a grandfather. I think it was the high point of his life! To live to see your grandchildren is truly a blessing and to be a grandchild is one of life's most precious blessings as well.

This same Sunday, July 24, our Bishop David M. O'Connell, has established a second collection for the retired priests, our spiritual grandfathers. Each year the number retired priests grows as the large ordination classes reach the golden years. All of these priests continue to assist our parishes and there is no dust under their feet, they help out wherever there is a need. Caring for them is increasingly difficult and the Bishop has asked for our help as not to forget their faithful service. Please be generous our retired priests on this weekend.

Traditional Mass Catechesis by Fr. Jim
Mass is Atonement

Thus far, we have discussed the Mass as *adoration*, *thanksgiving*, and *petition*. The Mass is also *atonement*. Through the Sacrifice of the Mass, we apply the Blood of Christ for the forgiveness of sins. Under the Law of Moses, particular sacrifices were attributed to each of these, however, these were replaced by Christ's Perfect Sacrifice on the Cross. The word *atonement* means to make reparation for sin against God. Christ accomplishes this through the Paschal Mystery.

In the Old Law, there was only a single day of *atonement*, but in the New Law, the Perfect Sacrifice of Christ is renewed in the Mass, where Christ is both Priest and Victim. As the Sacrifice of Christ is a perpetual memorial for us, so too is the *atonement* with God that he has won for us by his Precious Blood.

Come join us on Sundays at 12PM for a more traditional version of the *Novus Ordo* Mass.


