Dear Parish Family,

Next weekend, our parish will take part in the Missionary Cooperative Plan organized by the United States Conference of Bishops. Every summer, our Bishop invites missionaries from around the world to visit each parish and ask for your prayers, encouragement, and financial support.

This year, the Congregation for the Mission, also known as the "Vincentians," has been invited to every parish in our Diocese. They are working to build a seminary in Madagascar to train priests and lay missionaries. The Bishops of Africa have asked for this support because they see training future clergy as a top priority for the Church in their region.

Madagascar is the fourth-largest island in the world, located off the southeast coast of Africa in the Indian Ocean. It is about the size of Texas and is known for its rich biodiversity. The official languages are French and Malagasy. Madagascar is a semi-presidential republic with a population of over 31 million people.

The Vincentians are a missionary society founded in Paris on April 17, 1625, by St. Vincent de Paul, who was a diocesan priest. He named the community the "Congregation of the Mission" (C.M.), inspired by the words from Luke 4:18: "The Holy Spirit sent me to bring Good News to the poor." In 1633, with help from St. Louise de Marillac, St. Vincent also founded the "Company of the Daughters of Charity." One of their best-known members was St. Catherine Laboure, whose 1830 visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary led to the Miraculous Medal. Those who joined the pilgrimage to France may remember visiting the incorrupt bodies of St. Vincent, St. Louise, and St. Catherine, and praying at the chair where the Blessed Mother sat during the apparitions in the Motherhouse of the Daughters of Charity, where we also celebrated Mass.

Madagascar was the first non-European mission for the Vincentians, who arrived there in 1648. They have served there for 400 years. Today, they have formed the First General Assembly of the Vincentian Family of Africa and Madagascar (VIFAM) to better serve the missionary needs of the poor. They have also established St. Vincent de Paul University to train leaders for Madagascar and Africa.

One of the Vincentian priests is Father Pedro Opeka, an Argentine born in 1948. In 1989, while teaching, he saw a photo of children living on a landfill. He shares, "I came across this picture of thousands of children on piles of garbage. Seeing them live there, fighting with the animals, fighting over scraps of waste to eat, shocked me. I couldn't speak anymore. I fell to my knees and prayed to the Lord to help me do something with his children." Since his father was a bricklayer from Slovenia, Father Pedro decided to organize the people and teach them to work at a nearby granite deposit to earn a living. Twenty-five years later, he says, "The mine provides work to many and finances a large part of the collective services. Today, 25,000 people live in Akamasoa, which some call "City of Friendship." The adults work, the children go to school, play sports, and frequent social facilities. Places of prayer have been created, which the Malagasy Episcopal Conference has also used for its retreats. In thirty years, eighteen villages have been built, with brick houses and paved streets. Each of the villages is home to a thousand people, who now have shops, workshops, fountains, lighting, schools, nurseries, health centres, a hospital, administrative offices, meeting rooms, sports fields, and places of worship. All the inhabitants work, and in each village the community manages its own local government." He adds, "I want to honour all the missionaries who work in the woods, in the forests and in the villages, who keep the people's hope alive until one day justice and work arrive. Without them, Africa would be in a worse place. With Akamasoa we have shown that poverty is not inevitable. We must believe in it and commit ourselves to the poor."

Fr. Pedro is just one of many priests, religious, and lay missionaries working among the poor. His words remind us that poverty is not inevitable, and if we commit ourselves to helping the poor, we can overcome injustice. This is the mission of the Congregation of the Mission, and as disciples of Jesus, we can support people like Fr. Pedro in carrying out the work of the Gospel.

Please be generous next weekend in supporting the Congregation of the Mission. They are the community that gave us our Bishop, David M. O'Connell, C.M., who is a member of their society.

A basket will be placed near the Baptismal Font, clearly marked for the MCP Appeal. Thank you in advance for your welcoming hospitality to the Vincentian representative who will preach at all the Masses next weekend. Each of us is important, and each of us contributes in our own way to the success of the Vincentian Missionaries in Madagascar.

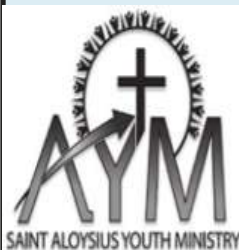
