Dear Parish Family,

We welcome back Fr. RJ, who went home a little over a month ago to visit his family in the Philippines.

On Friday, the Church celebrated the Feast of St. Benedict of Nursia, the Father of Western Monasticism. His twin sister is also a saint, St. Scholastica, who founded the female Benedictine Order. They are buried together in the same tomb at Monte Cassino in Italy. When the Monastery was bombed by the allied forces during World War II, on bad intelligence that the Nazi's had taken over the Monastery, the complex was leveled. A massive bomb fell at the back of the high altar and landed on top of their tomb. Miraculously, it did not detonate, and their tomb remained intact.

On Monday, we will remember the American, Kateri Tekakwitha, known as "The Lily of the Mohawks" of Auriesville, New York. Her father was Mohawk, and her mother was of Algonquin descent. A convert to Catholicism at age 19, who consecrated herself to Virginity for Christ, and was a catechist assisting the Jesuits. She suffered from Smallpox and was disfigured; upon her death, her natural beauty was restored.

Tuesday is the Feast of St. Bonaventure, the 7th Minister General of the Franciscans, who, upon being named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Sixtus V, was given the title "The Seraphic Doctor". His parents credited St. Francis of Assisi for a miracle that saved his life in his youth. He was a prolific writer in Theology, Spirituality, Philosophy, Metaphysics, and many other areas. He is famous for writing the definitive biography of St. Francis of Assisi. He was a bishop and a Cardinal, and he accomplished all of this before his death at the age of 55!

Wednesday is the Carmelite Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Mount Carmel is located in modern Haifa, in the North of Israel, also known as Mount Mar Elias or, in English, Mount of St. Elijah the Prophet. It was on this mountain that the Prophet Elijah lived in a cave, still preserved at the site today. It was here that the Order of Carmelites was founded in 1209 and dedicated to the Virgin Mary under her title, Star of the Sea, in a beautiful location with stunning sea views. The Feast itself commemorates the giving of the Brown Scapular to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite Hermit, by the Blessed Virgin Mary in the year 1251. St. Simon said our Lady gave him a piece of her cloak. Pope St. John Paul II taught about the brown scapular, *"Therefore two truths are evoked by the sign of the Scapular: on the one hand, the constant protection of the Blessed Virgin, not only on life's journey, but also at the moment of passing into the fullness of eternal glory; on the other, the awareness that devotion to her cannot be limited to prayers and tributes in her honor on certain occasions, but must become a "habit", that is, a permanent orientation of one's own Christian conduct, woven of prayer and interior life, through frequent reception of the sacraments and the concrete practice of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy"*.

The week concludes on Friday with the Feast of St. Camillus de Lellis, one of my favorite saints, from southern Italy and an unlikely candidate for sainthood, who lived a dissolute life of drinking, gambling, arguing, fighting, and military service. He was wounded in battle in his leg, and the wound never healed. At 24, he had a conversion and entered Religious life as a Capuchin on three separate occasions and was expelled each time. Eventually, he went to Rome and encountered St. Philip Neri, who encouraged and financially supported him in his pursuit of the priesthood. After his Ordination, he founded the Order of Clerks Regular, Ministers of the Infirm, now known as the Camillians. His order and his life were dedicated to caring for the sick and included many sanitary procedures to heal wounds. He discovered many people were buried alive in his time and ordered his followers to wait 15 minutes before burying someone to ensure they were truly dead. He is co-patron of the sick along with St. John of God.

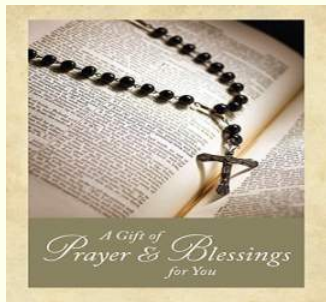

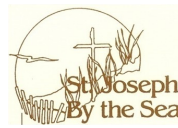

A DOUBLE CANONIZATION MARKS A NEW PAPAL CHAPTER POPE LEO XIV SETS DATES FOR FRASSATI AND ACUTIS

In one of his major acts following the death of Pope Francis, Pope Leo XIV has formally set the dates for a series of canonizations that promise to resonate deeply with Catholics across continents and generations. In a solemn gathering on June 13th in the Vatican's Consistory Hall, he presided over the Hour of Terce and a Public Consistory, issuing decrees that will inscribe nine blessed into the official register of saints. Among them are two names that have captured the spiritual hunger of today's youth: **PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI** and **CARLO ACUTIS**. Their joint canonization is set for Sunday, September 7, 2025.



CARLO ACUTIS, the 15-year-old Italian tech-savvy teen who created a website cataloging Eucharistic miracles before his death in 2006, was beatified in Assisi in 2020. He has quickly become an icon of "ordinary sanctity", fusing deep devotion with contemporary life



PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI, who died at 24 in 1925, was known for his vibrant faith, social activism, and love of the poor. For decades he has been a quiet patron of Students and young Catholics seeking meaning beyond materialism.



Sacrament of Baptism—Baptisms are held most Sundays at 12:00pm. Parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism Prep Class. To schedule a Baptism, or for more information, call the parish office 732-370-0500 ext. 204. Only parents can schedule their child's Baptism.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)—Have you or a loved one missed out on some sacraments or do you know someone considering becoming Catholic? Our OCIA program is here to support you, with a dedicated community of catechists eager to help you prepare for the Sacraments of the Church and the joy of meeting the Lord. Let our team of faith-filled individuals assist you on this journey towards a deeper connection with your faith. Classes resume in September, but it's not too early to register. Reach out to the parish office today for more information and take the first step towards enriching your spiritual life.

Sacrament of Matrimony—We welcome and congratulate all couples who live in Jackson seeking the Sacrament of Matrimony. Church arrangements and marriage prep are best made at least one year in advance. All couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana Conference as part of their preparation. Call the parish office for information. If you are making plans for a “destination wedding”, please call the parish office first. There is a way to receive the Sacrament of Marriage before your destination wedding.

Marriage Convalidation—A Marriage Convalidation is a special wedding ceremony that allows you to have your existing marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Once convalidated, your marriage will be fully embraced by the Church, granting it all the spiritual blessings and benefits it offers (i.e. Sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation). If you are interested in learning more about a Marriage Convalidation, contact the parish office.

Annulments—For many people, the process of marriage annulments is very mysterious and emotional, often accompanied by considerable misinformation. In order to dispel misconceptions, and obtain assistance about your particular situation, contact the parish office. Each request is as unique as the persons who entered the marriage, and many people express the fear of re-opening old wounds and hurts by going through a Church process of nullity or dissolution., Yet the deeper self-understanding that can come from an honest and searching study of one's broken marriage can heal these wounds and hurts much more profoundly, and provide part of the solid foundation for a lasting and successful marriage in the future. Anointing of the Sick—In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick (formerly referred to as “Last Rites”) is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic “who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age”. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. 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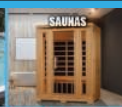
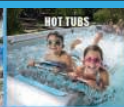
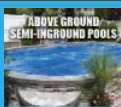
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
