Dear Parish Family-

Our new Parochial Vicar, Fr. RJ, is settling in and learning the routine pretty fast. He was by himself last week as I was away as Retreat Master for a group of Nuns. I am told he did just fine. His official welcome party will be a Communion Breakfast following the 10:30am Mass on Sunday August 6th in Morello Hall, the Knights of Columbus will be providing the breakfast for the event. This date was chosen as it falls closest to the Feast of St. John Vianney (Aug. 4), the Patron Saint of Parish Priests. Our Parish Catechetical Leader, Jen Petrillo, was thrilled as it is also the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord.

Fr. Jim Smith, our former Parochial Vicar, is settling in as the new pastor at St. Isaac Joques in Evesham. I offer thanks to the Knights of Columbus who went to Evesham to give him a hand moving some heavy stuff around. I went to visit him on Friday and give him a hand on a small project. He is doing well and very grateful for the kind and generous farewell. Some of our parishioners went down on his first Saturday and on his first Sunday in the new assignment and he welcomed the familiar faces. When a priest begins a new assignment and folks come from the previous assignment, it helps to ease the anxiety of starting in a new place by seeing familiar faces!

More good news on the 'former' Parochial Vicar scene, Fr. Fernando Lopez was officially accepted as a Chaplain Candidate for the United State Air Force on July 11, fulfilling a long time dream of his. This new assignment will also assist him in completing his postgraduate Psychology Degree. Congratulations to Fr. Fernando.

Summers seem to be getting shorter. I can remember when school let out earlier and we had the months of June, July and August. But now school lets out at the end of June, we have July and by August sports, extracurricular activities and back to school events start to roll in by the first week. So for many folks with children July is summer! That is a short summer for sure!

We have still not had any word on a start date for the re-roofing project on the New Church. Only that it is estimated to start in July but it is looking like it could be August at this point. When it starts there will be very short notice and all weekday (at this point) religious services and visits will be restricted to Gonzaga Hall. Gonzaga Hall will be set up as a temporary Church and all daily Masses, Funerals and personal visits will be restricted to that place until the roofing work is complete, which is estimated to conclude by November. Your patience, understanding and cooperation is appreciated in advance. There is still a possibility of having to transfer weekend services to Gonzaga Hall at some time depending on what unfolds during re-roofing.

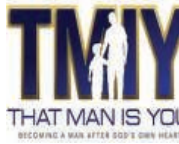




Beginning July 2, the 12:00pm Solemn Mass will no longer be on the schedule. If you are looking for a Traditional Mass, please contact the parish office for locations.

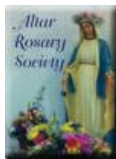

Does God Care What I Wear To Church?

Activities and vacations can make getting to Mass each week seem like a juggling act. Harder still is finding the time to dress properly and prepare as we would like. But approaching all aspects of the Eucharist carefully can deepen our Communion with Christ. What we wear can help. Here are a few thoughts: Make it feel special. If you were invited to a friend's house, wouldn't you wear something appropriate and nice? Sunday Mass is a special time for you and God. Wearing good clothes makes it feel special. Send a message. Mass is also a communal celebration. When you look nice in church, you send a message to your Catholic brothers and sisters that you value your time together in God's house. Just because it's "in style" doesn't make it "in style" for God. Use this guideline. When deciding what to wear in Church, think about this: If it's something you would wear to the beach or pool, to play a sport, or to clean out the garage or the house, don't wear it to church – even when on vacation.

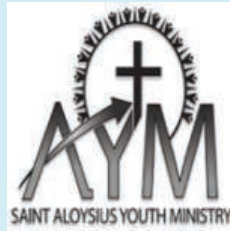
