From the Pastor
Dear Parish Family-

Next Sunday July 24 will be celebrated as International World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, we will give a special blessing at all Masses.

A reminder to mark your calendars for Saturday August 6 following the 5pm Mass join us in celebrating with Msgr. Joe his 60th Anniversary of Ordination and his 85th Birthday, both milestones. There will be a wine and cheese social following the Mass in Gonzaga Hall.

Each year the Diocese of Trenton takes part in what is known as the 'Missionary Cooperative Plan'. I know this may be confusing because we have so many mission collections but the Missionary Cooperative Plan is not another envelope in your box.

The Missionary Cooperative Plan is an opportunity for Missionary Societies to educate, promote and invite direct participation in the Missionary Activities of the Church. The Diocese vets and assigns a different Mission group to each parish in the Diocese. The Mission society then assigns one of their members/associates/cooperators to come to the Parish and speak at all the Masses about the work of their particular society. Sometimes they are from a far flung mission sometimes they are from our own country.

This year our parish was assigned 'Mary's Meals' a volunteer charity based out of Glasgow Scotland founded by a layman named Magnus MacFarlane-Barrow, they have a local branch in Bloomfield, New Jersey. They are a volunteer network of people who work to primarily provide healthy well balanced meals and education to children living in poverty across the globe. They were scheduled (as previously announced) to be here this month however due to staffing and scheduling issues they have postponed their visit until the weekend of August 27/28. Please be generous.

The Missionary Cooperative Plan is an essential evangelical tool of our Church to bring to light the many mission activities and a reminder that we are called to have the heart of a missionary. Exposure to these various mission societies each year helps us to take part in the missionary activity of the global Church.

Traditional Mass Catechesis by Fr. Jim Mass is Atonement

Thus far, we have discussed the Mass as **adoration, thanksgiving, and petition**. The Mass is also **atonement**. Through the Sacrifice of the Mass, we apply the Blood of Christ for the forgiveness of sins. Under the Law of Moses, particular sacrifices were attributed to each of these, however, these were replaced by Christ's Perfect Sacrifice on the Cross. The word **atonement** means to make reparation for sin against God. Christ accomplishes this through the Paschal Mystery.

In the Old Law, there was only a single day of **atonement**, but in the New Law, the Perfect Sacrifice of Christ is renewed in the Mass, where Christ is both Priest and Victim. As the Sacrifice of Christ is a perpetual memorial for us, so too is the **atonement** with God that he has won for us by his Precious Blood.

Come join us on Sundays at 12PM for a more traditional version of the **Novus Ordo** Mass.


