Dear Parish Family,

On Monday July 19, work will begin on the assembly of the new Altar of Repose in the Church. The work will require some structural support due to the weight of the Mensa Stone (top stone of the Altar) which weighs nearly 2000 pounds. Assembly will require rigging as well to lift the stones into place. Thus the Church will be closed from Monday July 19 through Friday July 23. Please do not attempt to enter the Church while the work is underway. Your cooperation is appreciated for your safety and the safety of the workers. All Masses (including Funerals) for the week of July 19-23 will be held in the Gonzaga Hall, the old Church. All private visits for prayer will be in Gonzaga Hall. The Blessed Sacrament will be removed from the Church and reposed in Gonzaga Hall for the week.


I met with the Atelier foreman/project manager and mason last Thursday to go over final details of the plan and scope of work. They believe the project can be completed in the time frame proposed. This of course could change for unforeseen reasons. If they need more time that will be announced in next weekend's bulletin.

While I was naturally excited about this project finally coming to fruition after the long pandemic that delayed it, I was pleasantly surprised the workmen shared that excitement. They normally are doing work at great heights, in difficult conditions, in heat and cold and rarely do Church projects. They were very happy the Altar did not go into a bar or some other secular use. They were pleased to have found a Church home for the Altar in accord with the hopes of the original client and that it will return to a sacred use after sitting in pieces in a warehouse for many years. So all around joy and happiness and I am sure we will all be pleased with the end result.

The Altar will be placed directly behind the current Altar of Sacrifice, making the Blessed Sacrament visible to the entire Church. The current configuration with the Tabernacle in a separate room, only allows the Blessed Sacrament to be visible to a small section off the main aisle. At a time in American Catholic life where so many no longer believe in the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, this is a small but decisive step on the path to re-Catechize. Making the Tabernacle more visible, not less visible, reminds people of the importance of the Holy Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ. We learn by words, deeds and actions. May our reverence and appreciation of Christ's great gift of himself in the Blessed Sacrament be strengthened and renewed.


