NaPro: A Pathway of Healing and Peace By Jen Petrillo

A few weeks ago, our pastor Fr. Bambrick asked me if I would be open to sharing about my husband and my journey with infertility and treatment through NaPro Technology. This conversation was prompted by an excellent article from Catholic News Agency called "Catholic OB-GYN Finds Life-Changing Alternative to IVF," by Kate Quiñones. With in vitro fertilization (IVF) getting more and more attention in the media, and even being strongly supported by some of our politicians, Fr. Bambrick thought it would beneficial to provide some education on NaPro Technology, which is a *radically* different approach. Whereas IVF is incompatible with Catholic morality (even if done with good intentions), NaPro Technology is a well-developed science that approaches women's health and fertility in a way that is in keeping with the dignity of the human person, and thus in harmony with Catholic ethical standards. I wholeheartedly agreed with Fr. Bambrick, and I'm honored that he asked me to share.

First, let me explain some terms. "NaPro" is short for "Natural Procreative Technology." The word "technology" may be a little misleading. Whereas the word "technology" often calls to mind electronic devices, apps, and now Artificial Intelligence, the word simply means "the practical application of knowledge especially in a particular area" (according to Merriam-Webster). NaPro Technology is "a women's health science that monitors and maintains a woman's reproductive and gynecological health. It provides medical and surgical treatments that cooperate completely with the reproductive system . . . It is a fertility-care based medical approach rather than a fertility-control approach to family planning and gynecological health" (https://naprotechnology.com/). NaPro Technology works with the information that is gathered through using the Creighton Model FertilityCare System (see https://creightonmodel.com/). The Pope Paul VI Institute at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska is essentially the hub of NaPro training and research in the United States (https://saintpaulvi.com/), and there are trained practitioners throughout the U.S and beyond. The Creighton Model is a form of Natural Family Planning (NFP), and the data from this system can be used to either avoid or achieve pregnancy (depending upon what the couple discerns would be best for their family at a given time).

I think that the key words here are "natural" and "cooperate." When approaching any health issue, a NaProtrained physician seeks to get to the root cause. If a woman comes to a NaPro physician with polycystic ovarian disease, endometriosis, hormonal imbalances, unexplained infertility, repetitive miscarriages, abnormal bleeding, or any other health concern, the physician pursues treatment that simply helps the women's body to heal and to function the way that a healthy body should. There are no attempts to impede or override the natural workings of her reproductive system. Putting a patient on hormonal birth control is *never* offered as a solution to a medical problem. The question of infertility is met with a comprehensive approach aimed at genuine health, healing, and hope; a couple is *never* referred to an IVF clinic. Any attempts to conceive a child always take place within the marital embrace, and the destruction or freezing of embryos is *never* part of the process.

Now, before I share a bit of our own story, let me offer a disclaimer. My husband and I know firsthand the ache of longing for a child. We know what it's like to feel empty-handed while all our closest friends are having children. We know the awkwardness that comes when well-meaning acquaintances (or people we barely know) innocently asked when we would have children, having no idea how much pain that question caused. We know the feeling of celebrating Mother's Day and Father's Day year after year, rejoicing in the motherhood and fatherhood of family and friends, wondering if we will ever have the privilege of being called "mom" and "dad." We spent years taking consolation in the roles of godmother and godfather to the children of family and close friends, and trying to appreciate the opportunities to be "fruitful" through service and hospitality to others.

If anyone is reading this and has carried the cross of infertility, please know that we get it. If anyone reading this has pursued IVF in the past, or on the other hand, has used artificial contraception to limit the size of your family, we are not here to judge or condemn. Persons who are created using IVF are still made in the image and likeness of God, with an inviolable dignity and worth. We know that sadly, NaPro Technology and the methods and benefits of NFP still seem to be a best-kept secret in many circles. We are just here to share, and to help get the word out that there *is* a better way, one that is in accord with our dignity as human persons and thus compatible with Catholic morality.

I was very blessed that, about five years before I got married, I had already started seeing a NaPro doctor to address some health issues. My roommate at the time had recommended Dr. Jean Golden-Tevald of Morning-star Family Health Center. Thanks to Dr. Jean, I learned how to chart according to the Creighton Method, and was able to discover and receive treatment for a major hormonal imbalance. Charting is not just for women looking to achieve or avoid pregnancy; it can yield very valuable information for any woman looking to better understand her own health. The data from my charts, coupled with a series of blood tests, helped us to pinpoint the hormonal issue.

When my husband and I were preparing for marriage, we met several times with a good friend who was a FertilityCare practitioner, so that we could learn the Creighton Method of Natural Family Planning together. It was so helpful for me to already have a basic understanding of this, which I could build on as my husband and I prepared to begin our married life together. I felt so incredibly blessed that my husband was 100% on board, and even though biology is not his forte, he made a strong effort to understand the information and to process how this would be integrated into our married life.

As mentioned above, NFP can be used to avoid or achieve pregnancy. It all centers on identifying days of fertility. A couple would abstain on days of fertility if they are looking to avoid pregnancy. They would choose to be intimate on days of fertility if their goal is to achieve pregnancy. For NFP couples who are desiring to achieve pregnancy, it is recommended that if they do not conceive within six months of trying, they should work with a physician to see if there are underlying health issues that need to be addressed. Once we had begun our new life together and were trying to start a family, those six months came and went. Thankfully, my husband and I were able to return to Dr. Jean, who compassionately and prayerfully walked with us throughout our journey, a journey which lasted over six years. During that time frame, Dr. Jean diagnosed multiple health issues and was able to refer me to NaPro-trained surgeons when necessary. We dealt with the ongoing hormonal imbalance, along with uterine polyps, luteinized unruptured follicles, endometriosis (for which I had three surgeries), and a few uterine infections. Our journey involved a lot of time and dedication, including traveling significant distances to meet with Dr. Jean and later Dr. Naomi Whittaker, who did my second and third surgeries. Although we experienced a mix of hope and heartbreak with each month that passed as we strove to trust in God's providence, we always had a tremendous gift: the peace of knowing that every measure that was recommended to us was in line with our Catholic faith and morals.

With Dr. Jean Golden-Tevald, Dr. Kyle Beiter (who did my first surgery, but is now in Ohio), and Dr. Naomi Whittaker (who did my second and third surgeries), we never had to question whether a procedure was ethical. We knew that we could totally entrust ourselves to their expertise and care. You do not have to be Catholic to be a NaPro physician, but every NaPro physician I have met is a very faith-filled Catholic. I think that this is because the NaPro approach is totally in harmony with Catholic moral teaching, so for physicians who take their faith seriously and want to work in the field of women's reproductive health, NaPro affords them the opportunity to practice medicine in a way that really is grounded in a Catholic understanding of the human person.

I remember having a conversation with my husband before my first surgery. Although now I feel like a pro when it comes to abdominal surgery, the decision to go ahead with the first one was definitely scary, even though we knew that Dr. Jean was advising the best course of action for us. My husband asked me, "So, what would happen if you didn't have the surgery?" I replied, "Well, apart from the infertility, if I don't have the surgery, I'll still have scar tissue growing on my organs and interfering with their ability to function, and *that's* not good . . ." Throughout each step of our journey, I knew that we were moving towards getting me healthy and healed. Even though we were seeking all this treatment with the main goal of one day getting pregnant, along the way we had the benefit of knowing that underlying health issues were being addressed.

We did get to the point when, after my third surgery, I had a clean bill of health for several months, and we still had not conceived. During that time, as we continued to pray for discernment in knowing God's will for our family, the idea of adoption was coming up. We kept encountering people who had adopted and were willing to share their story with us. We finally really opened our minds and hearts to the possibility that God was calling us to this path, and we spent much of our spare time in the summer of 2023 researching adoption and keeping in touch with my cousin and her husband who had adopted their daughter. In August of 2023, Nick and I had our parents over for dinner to share with them the news that we had decided to start the adoption process. In October of 2023, we had our parents over for dinner again to share the joyful and shocking news that I was pregnant. We had just found a social worker to do our home study, and before we even told our parents, we called our social worker to let her know that God had other plans at this time!

The first person who knew that our little one was on the way was our dear Dr. Jean. We did not know it at the time, but the day that we found out we were expecting was the feast of Our Lady of La Leche, October 11th. About a year and a half prior, my parents had prayed for us at the beautiful Shrine of Our Lady of La Leche in St. Augustine, Florida. For centuries, this has been a powerful pilgrimage site, where pilgrims seek Our Lady's intercession, especially related to fertility, pregnancy, and a healthy delivery. I am 100% sure that our son would not be with us if it were not for NaPro Technology, and the wonderful NaPro physicians who have taken phenomenal care of our family, but I am equally sure that our son is the fruit of the many prayers that were offered for us along our journey, especially through the intercession of Our Lady of La Leche.

Thanks so much for taking the time to read this. Our hearts are filled with gratitude, as we continue to pray and discern God's will for our family. It is beyond our wildest dreams that we get to be parents, and we truly hope that our son will become a big brother someday. 


