Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, we celebrate World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis instituted it for the first time on July 25, 2021. Pope Francis was very close to his grandparents, often speaking fondly of his grandmother, Rosa. He chose this celebration on the weekend closest to the Feast of SS. Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus, and the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Their Feast this year fell on Saturday, July 26. Pope Francis chose the theme for this year's celebration before his death: "Blessed are those who have not lost hope," taken from the Book of Sirach, chapter 14, verse 2.

In his message for this 5th World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, Pope Leo XIV writes, "*In the Bible, God repeatedly demonstrates his providential care by turning to people in their later years. This was the case not only with Abraham, Sarah, Zechariah and Elizabeth, but also with Moses, who was called to set his people free when he was already eighty years old (cf. Ex 7:7). God thus teaches us that, in his eyes, old age is a time of blessing and grace, and that the elderly are, for him, the first witnesses of hope. Augustine asks, "What do we mean by old age?" He tells us that God himself answers the question: "Let your strength fail, so that my strength may abide within you, and you can say with the Apostle, 'When I am weak, then I am strong'" (Super Ps. 70,11). The increasing number of elderly people is a sign of the times that we are called to discern, in order to interpret properly this moment of history.*

The life of the Church and the world can only be understood in light of the passage of generations. Embracing the elderly helps us to understand that life is more than just the present moment, and should not be wasted in superficial encounters and fleeting relationships. Instead, life is constantly pointing us toward the future. In the book of Genesis, we find the moving episode of the blessing given by the aged Jacob to his grandchildren, the sons of Joseph; his words are an appeal to look to the future with hope, as the time when God's promises will be fulfilled (cf. Gen 48:8-20). If it is true that the weakness of the elderly needs the strength of the young, it is equally true that the inexperience of the young needs the witness of the elderly in order to build the future with wisdom. How often our grandparents have been for us examples of faith and devotion, civic virtue and social commitment, memory and perseverance amid trials! The precious legacy that they have handed down to us with hope and love will always be a source of gratitude and a summons to perseverance.

As elderly persons, we can hope. The Book of Sirach calls blessed those who have not lost hope (cf. 14:2). Perhaps, especially if our lives are long, we may be tempted to look not to the future but to the past. Yet, as Pope Francis wrote during his last hospitalization, "our bodies are weak, but even so, nothing can prevent us from loving, praying, giving ourselves, being there for one another, in faith, as shining signs of hope" (Angelus, 16 March 2025). We possess a freedom that no difficulty can rob us of: it is the freedom to love and to pray. Everyone, always, can love and pray."

Pope Leo goes on to reflect that love and affection in the family do not fade and that love and affection between grandparents and grandchildren "revives our energy and brings us hope and comfort." This has been my life experience as a great-grandchild and grandchild. Even today, the living memory, affection, and love of my great-grandparents and grandparents do not fade but continue to sustain me.



Sacrament of Baptism—Baptisms are held most Sundays at 12:00pm. Parents and Godparents are required to attend a Baptism Prep Class. To schedule a Baptism, or for more information, call the parish office 732-370-0500 ext. 204. Only parents can schedule their child's Baptism.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)—Have you or a loved one missed out on some sacraments or do you know someone considering becoming Catholic? Our OCIA program is here to support you, with a dedicated community of catechists eager to help you prepare for the Sacraments of the Church and the joy of meeting the Lord. Let our team of faith-filled individuals assist you on this journey towards a deeper connection with your faith. Classes resume in September, but it's not too early to register. Reach out to the parish office today for more information and take the first step towards enriching your spiritual life.

Sacrament of Matrimony—We welcome and congratulate all couples who live in Jackson seeking the Sacrament of Matrimony. Church arrangements and marriage prep are best made at least one year in advance. All couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana Conference as part of their preparation. Call the parish office for information. If you are making plans for a “destination wedding”, please call the parish office first. There is a way to receive the Sacrament of Marriage before your destination wedding.

Marriage Convalidation—A Marriage Convalidation is a special wedding ceremony that allows you to have your existing marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Once convalidated, your marriage will be fully embraced by the Church, granting it all the spiritual blessings and benefits it offers (i.e. Sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation). If you are interested in learning more about a Marriage Convalidation, contact the parish office.

Annulments—For many people, the process of marriage annulments is very mysterious and emotional, often accompanied by considerable misinformation. In order to dispel misconceptions, and obtain assistance about your particular situation, contact the parish office. Each request is as unique as the persons who entered the marriage, and many people express the fear of re-opening old wounds and hurts by going through a Church process of nullity or dissolution,. Yet the deeper self-understanding that can come from an honest and searching study of one's broken marriage can heal these wounds and hurts much more profoundly, and provide part of the solid foundation for a lasting and successful marriage in the future. Anointing of the Sick—In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick (formerly referred to as “Last Rites”) is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic “who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age”. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
