Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, July 28th, in the global Catholic Church, is World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis chose the theme, taken from Psalm 71, "Do Not Cast Me Off in My Old Age". The Holy Father Francis wrote, "to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly people, so often the victims of the throwaway culture." A Plenary Indulgence is granted to anyone who visits a sick, lonely, or disabled elderly person on the fourth annual World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly on July 28th, along with the usual conditions to obtain a plenary indulgence; detachment from all sin, to receive sacramental confession and Holy Communion, and to pray for the pope's intentions.

This chosen Sunday always falls closest to the feast of St. Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus, which is July 26th. Last year the Holy Father, speaking on the relationship between old and young said, "How much we need a new bond between young and old, so that the sap of those who have a long experience of life behind them will nourish the shoots of hope of those who are growing. In this fruitful exchange we can learn the beauty of life, build a fraternal society, and in the Church, be enabled to encounter one another and dialogue between tradition and the newness of the Spirit."



My maternal grandparents gave us jellied slice candy and chocolates. My great-grandmother gave us half a saucer of coffee with the other half cream, and three sugars! Yup, very sweet and I drank coffee like that well into adulthood with people horrified at the sight of it! LOL

Grandparents bring joy into the lives of their grandchildren. We saw our grandparents every week, and in summer, spent whole weeks under their care. My cousin and I would go fishing, and see our grandfather drinking beer in his car by the water and sneak up on him. He would bribe us by giving us money to buy French fries at the fishery in exchange for not telling our grandmother we saw him! What fun we had with them and how many wonderful memories. I keep pictures of them all in my room, and looking upon them, the joy of my time with them is brought into the present! AND THE REPERLY

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
