Dear Parish Family-

Next weekend we will celebrate Msgr. Joe's 60th Anniversary of Priesthood and his 85th Birthday, these two milestones of his life, on Saturday August 6 at the 5pm Mass and there will be a wine and cheese social following the Mass in Gonzaga Hall.

It has been some time since I have written about the Synod and many of you might be glad I have stopped writing about it! The Synod on Synodality entitled; "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission" has three phases, the first phase was the Diocesan Phase. Our Bishop David M. O'Connell declared the Diocesan Phase closed at the Chrism Mass during Holy Week 2022. We are currently in the Continental Phase where the responses from the many Dioceses are being synthesized to be presented at the World Wide Phase concluding in 2023 with the Meeting of Bishop's in Rome with Pope Francis.

The Diocese of Trenton has collated and synthesized all the responses from the parishes of the Diocese of Trenton and made public that final report. I read the report over the course of last weekend. It was an interesting read. There were 884 group responses, 83 individual interviews and 216 people filled out an online survey. There were a total of 4,500 individual participants in the Diocesan phase; the Diocese is composed of more than 630,000 Catholics. There were 400 parishioners who volunteered to undertake the necessary multi-day training to facilitate and note take for the process.

Sadly only 2/3rds or 66% of our parishes participated. 33% of the parishes of the Diocese did nothing. The good news is that 64 parishes, 70 priests and 156 deacons actively participated in and cooperated with the Holy Father's invitation to encourage participation. Many lay people stated they felt 'honored' the Holy Father offered them this invitation to participate in the Synod on Synodality. One key reoccurring theme among participants Diocesan wide was the need for younger people to be involved in Church however 42% of all respondents were over the age of 65, with 42% between 30-64 and only 16% under age 30! The entire process was open to everyone but only 16% of young people chose to participate.

Participants discussed all the ‘hot button’ issues currently vexing the church and society but they also expressed an overwhelming sense of hope and the importance of the Church in their life regardless of their current participation status in the Church. They identified a need for parishes to be more welcoming and hospitable, for priests to be more pastorally focused, for lay people to be less cliquish and more open to new parishioner participation in the life of the parish. There was a call for greater lay leadership models to be developed especially for women. They called for greater reverence at Mass by the priests and the people in creating a prayerful environment. They called for greater catechesis and opportunities to enrich their faith at the parishes. They expressed appreciation for the Synod process of “listening” without judgment or response, they liked that they were heard. They felt the movement of the Holy Spirit in the process and the life of the Universal Church. These and so many more things were identified and stated. There is a lot in the report that can inform and enlighten us at the parish and Diocesan level.

The Bishop offered a brief reflection at the end of the report saying he was grateful people found the process worthwhile and took time to participate. He sensed a real “journeying together” in the report. He also noted the report also reveals a need for better catechesis on Church Teachings. He also expressed his personal disappointment that 1/3rd of the parishes did not participate despite a substantial push from him and the Diocesan Synod Team and revealed and re-enforced the credibility of those who had negative comments about our Diocesan Church, he revealed his own sense of frustration not knowing how to motivate a better response from those parishes.

I hope you will take time to read the report and reflect on it as we continue to journey together in the Synod on Synodality. We can await the Continental phase conclusions and see if they track with our own Diocesan Synodal process. If this report is mirrored in other Diocesan reports across the continent it will certainly give the World Wide Bishop’s meeting in Rome in 2023 a lot of food for thought and hopefully some action.






