Dear Parish Family,

We have now entered August, named after Rome's first Emperor, Augustus Caesar. This is a venerable month, and it includes many saints' feast days such as Alphonsus Liguori, John Vianney, Sixtus II, Cajetan, Dominic, Lawrence, Clare, Jane Frances de Chantal, Pontain, Hippolytus, Maximillian Kolbe, John Eudes, Bernard, Pius X, the Apostle Bartholomew, Louis, Monica, and Augustine, just to name a few. I'm sure you recognize some or most of these remarkable saints.

August also brings three feasts honoring our Lady. On August 5, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Dedication of the Archbasilica of St. Mary Major, the oldest church in the West dedicated to Mary. It is also called the Liberian Basilica or Our Lady of the Snows. In the 4th century, Pope Liberius had a dream in which the Virgin Mary told him she would make snow fall during Rome's hot August weather. That same night, a member of Rome's Patrician class had the same dream. On August 5, snow fell on Esquiline Hill, one of Rome's seven hills. The Pope and John went there, and the Pope traced the outline of the Basilica in the snow with his staff, ordering the church to be dedicated to Mary. Less than 100 years later, the original Basilica was replaced by the larger one we see today. Both Liberius and John are buried there, and the Basilica holds many relics. The most important are in the Confessio under the Papal Altar, a small chapel with pieces of the crib that held the baby Jesus. In this chapel, it is always considered Christmas, and pilgrims are invited to sing a Christmas hymn while visiting.

The second Solemnity is the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Its original name was the Solemnity of the Dormition, meaning 'falling asleep,' which is still used in the Eastern Churches. In the West, it became known as the Assumption, marking Mary's entry into heaven at the end of her life. This Solemnity is a core belief for Catholics, requiring acceptance with mind and will. It is closely connected to the Redemption and is not unique to Mary. Mary, as the Mother of the Savior, gave her full consent to God at the Incarnation, saying yes to the Angel's message. She was the first believer, present with Jesus during his ministry and at Calvary. She did not need proof of the Resurrection because she already believed her Son's words. Jesus entrusted her to the care of the whole Church as he was about to die, and the Church was entrusted to care for her. Because she was the first believer, she is also the first to receive the fruits of redemption, experiencing the Resurrection and Ascension into heaven like her Son. The resurrection and ascension are not unique to her; they are promised to all believers. However, because of sin, we must wait for these events until the Lord comes again in glory, when our souls and bodies will be reunited and ascend to heaven with Jesus, Mary, and all the Saints. One of my favorite places in the Holy Land is the Church of the Dormition on Mount Zion. In the crypt, there is a statue of Mary lying in repose on a funeral couch. It is very lifelike and gives a sense of what the Apostles experienced at the end of Mary's life. In a way, you get to attend the Wake. **While this is not a holy day of obligation this year, so you are not required to attend Mass, the Knights of Columbus will have their Blessed Michael McGivney Mass at 12 noon if you would like to attend Mass on the Assumption.**

On August 22, we celebrate the Feast of the Queenship of Mary, which is one of the mysteries of the Rosary. After Mary's resurrection and ascension, the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—crowned her as queen of heaven and earth.

Finally, on August 6, we celebrate the Great Solemnity of our Lord, the Transfiguration, which took place on Mount Tabor—another of my favorite places in the Holy Land.

Let us take this month to grow spiritually and find enrichment together.

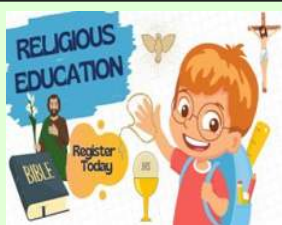

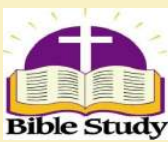


Prayer to St Michael The Archangel

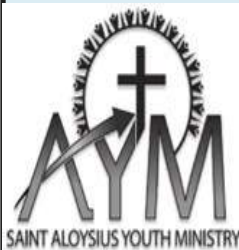
