Dear Parish Family,

Today, the thirty third Olympic Games, Paris 2024, will come to a conclusion. I do not follow sports closely, but love the Olympic Games, and find myself watching as much as is possible given my schedule. I have a TV on upstairs and downstairs all day, so when I come in or go out, I can catch part of the games. The Olympics are such a rich sporting event with such diversity, and interesting competitions, there is something for every fan!

Two of the top medal winners are Catholics; I should say two, who will no doubt be Olympic legends; Simon Biles (gymnastics), who carries a white rosary with her at every competition, and Katie Ledecky (swimming), who says she prays the Hail Mary before every event to calm her.

Did you know the Olympic Games are included in Scripture? St. Paul made several missionary journeys, which took him to Greece; he was born a Roman citizen in the Greek-speaking world, so he was very familiar with the games. I often wonder if he attended one of the ancient games at Olympia. He mentions the games in:

- 1 Corinthians 9:24-27; "Do you not know that the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize? Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we, an imperishable one. Thus I do not run aimlessly; I do not fight as if I were shadowboxing. No, I drive my body and train it, for fear that, after having preached to others, I myself should be disqualified"
- 1 Timothy 4:8; "while physical training is of limited value, devotion is valuable in every respect, since it holds a promise of life both for the present and for the future. This saying is trustworthy and deserves full acceptance."
- 2 Timothy 2:5; "Similarly, an athlete cannot receive the winner's crown except by competing according to the rules."

Hebrews 12:1-2; "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and persevere in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, Founder and Perfecter of Our Faith. For the sake of the joy that lay before him he endured the cross, despising its shame, and has taken his seat at the right of the throne of God."

Philippians 3:14; "I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus."

As I write this, the US Olympic Team has won 79 medals; 21 gold, 30 silver, and 28 bronze, with still some five days to go, Team USA is currently the top medal winner to date. Go Team USA!

St. Paul urges us to be like Olympic athletes in practicing our faith. In St. Paul's day there were no medals awarded, the winner was crowned with a wreath of laurel, so he tells us not to strive for the perishable crown of laurel, but for the imperishable crown of heaven! Compete well my fellow Christians, and let the games begin!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.


SO MUCH MORE THAN A BIBLE STUDY


