Yesterday, Saturday August 13th, our parish Knights of Columbus, along with other councils, gathered at our parish to celebrate Mass in honor of Blessed Michael McGivney. Fr. McGivney is the founder of the Knights of Columbus. He was beatified on October 31, 2020 at St. Joseph Cathedral in Hartford by Pope Francis designate Cardinal Joseph Tobin (Archbishop of Newark). Fr. McGivney was born on August 12, 1852 and died on August 14, 1890. His relics are entombed at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, the Mother Church of the Knights of Columbus and place where the Order was founded by Fr. McGivney when he was the Curate there. The Mass for his feast day may only be celebrated with permission by the Diocesan Bishop and, Bishop David M. O'Connell extended that permission this year to all priests of the Diocese. I encourage all the men of the parish to consider membership in the Knights of Columbus; it is the premier men's ministry of the Catholic Church. The Order does much good throughout the world and it's primary mission is Charity. Our Council is a joint council with St. Veronica in Howell. The Current Grand Knight is one of our parishioners, Phil Capasso.

Monday, August 15th is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary normally a Holy Day of Obligation. When Holy Days of Obligation fall on Saturdays or Mondays they remain Holy Days but **NOT** of Obligation. There will be one Mass on August 15th at 8:30am.

To honor the Solemnity of the Assumption, which is also the Patronal Feast of our Diocese, the Altar Rosary Society and the Music Ministry are presenting a "Concert of Aves" on Sunday Evening, August 14th at 7pm in the Church.
