Dear Parish Family,

Alas, the Olympics have ended. A friend called me Monday night and said, "With the Olympics over there is nothing for you to watch on TV!" I laughed and said, "Not true, I am watching a re-run of the Westminster Dog Show." Not quite the same as the Olympics, but a good competition none-the-less and, even though I already knew the winner (a flawless beautiful black Standard Poodle); it was still great to watch the dogs strut their stuff.

On Sunday, someone said, "Remember Father, dog spelled backwards is God; that is why they are so divine." Later the same day, a widow told me she wanted to adopt a dog as they make great companions, but she thought about her age, close to 90, then about all the care they need (baths, grooming, nails, ear cleaning, vet care), how they need to be walked several times a day in all kinds of weather and, finally all that fur on the floor, and on her clothes, so she decided against it, while still insisting a dog is a great companion. St. Dominic, whose feast just passed, was named by his mother after a dream she had while pregnant of a dog with a flaming torch in its mouth crossing her path. Thus, she named her son "the Dog of God", Dominic. I suppose I am barking up the wrong tree this week, but hey, its mid-August, summer is nearly over, the weather will change, the garden begins its decline, and school will soon start. But, we still have a few good weeks left!

Some folks called me last week asking if I sent them an e-mail requesting gift cards, this is an old scam which has been going on for years. When you open the e-mail it looks like it came from someone you know, but if you hover your mouse arrow over the address, a little box will drop down with the real address, which, is in fact, not my e-mail. Even our Bishop's name has been used, along with nearly every pastor in the Diocese. They ask you to buy gift cards, send them the numbers, scratch off the code on the back and e-mail it to them. Why on earth would I need you to do that????????? So, don't fall for the scam; myself, nor anyone on our staff, would ever ask you by e-mail to buy gift cards and e-mail us the information. Obviously people must fall for it since the scammers keep sending these emails out. Also, beware of the gypsies, it is gypsy season again; I spotted them across the road from the ShopRite in Freehold last week. Direct them to the St. Vincent de Paul Society, or another social service charity. Please do not give them your hard earned cash. They have rotating "families", are very organized, and good at not finding honest work!

Last Thursday was the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which marks the mid-point of August. A wonderful feast that points us all toward the coming reality of our own resurrection and ascension after death; Jesus died, rose and ascended, and the first person to enjoy the fruits of his victory, was his Holy Mother, who fell asleep in the Lord, and was taken, body and soul to heaven. This is the same journey we each hope to make, hers was immediate due to her total giving of self to God's Will, ours will be delayed due to sin, but Her Resurrection and Ascension (Assumption) is a foretaste and sign of hope for us.

Many of our shore parishes have the wonderful tradition of the blessing of the sea on the Solemnity of the Assumption. Thought to have started in the 15<sup>th</sup> Century after a Bishop was in a terrible storm at sea on this feast, he prayed to the Virgin for assistance, tossed his pastoral ring into the sea and, having survived each year, he blessed the sea in her honor and threw a floral ring into the sea.

Our Diocese is under the patronage of Our Lady under her title, "St. Mary of the Assumption."

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.






