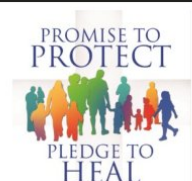

Dear Parish Family,

On the weekend of July 18th and 19th, our parish participated in the Missionary Cooperative Plan. Fr. Gontran, a young priest from the Congregation for Mission or Vincentians, came from Madagascar to make the appeal to help build a seminary in his country. The first missionaries arrived in Madagascar in the 1600s, sent by St. Vincent de Paul, making it the oldest Vincentian mission.

Fr. Gontran was sent to the United States by his Provincial to study at St. John's University in Queens, New York, which was founded and is sponsored by the Vincentians. He arrived in January 2026 to learn English (he speaks his native language and French) along with another young priest from Nigeria. Once completing their English proficiency tests, they will begin graduate studies and then return to Madagascar to teach at the seminary.

The Vincentians were invited to 30 parishes in the Diocese of Trenton, including ours, to ask for support to build a new Seminary in Madagascar. Our Bishop is also a Vincentian. Right now, the seminary was built to house 40 students but has 80 living in tight quarters. They need a building to accommodate 200 students, which matches the number of applicants they receive each year but have to turn away for lack of space.

Thanks to your generosity, that goal moves one step closer to reality. Fr. Gontran sent me a link to a YouTube video that explains the project. It is a fascinating video, and I share it with you so you can see how your donations are making a difference. The video shows beautiful scenes of Madagascar, and we see Fr. Jasso, who narrates, talking with Seminary students. It shows their tight quarters, lack of privacy and the difficult conditions they face. About halfway through, Fr. Jasso travels by car being tossed around on the same rough, dusty road the first missionaries once walked and very little has changed. The video concludes with him arriving at the first place the missionaries reached after an 18-month sea voyage. It's a really great video to understand missionary work and the challenges they face.

At the beginning of the video, Fr. Jasso calls those who give to the mission as people of "security". I had never heard that phrase before, but it struck a chord with me. We may not be wealthy, but we are secure. We have clean water, plenty of food, sanitary conditions, good roads to travel on, air conditioning, clothing, good educational institutions, housing, and all the basic necessities at our fingertips. We are people of "security". In this simple phrase, God sends us a message, a thank you for sharing some of our security with those who lack secure access to food, water, housing, clothing, and education. That is what the Missionary Cooperative Plan means to me: helping others live with security and sharing our blessings with them. In return, the seminary will send missionaries to work with the poor in Madagascar, bringing hope to those in need.

Please watch the video. It runs about 20 minutes long and has about four commercials you have to briefly endure, but the scenery and commentary are terrific. The link will also be on our parish website. Watching it, you'll instantly see the good you have done to help spread the Good News of Jesus Christ!

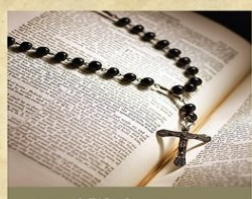

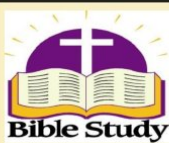


Prayer to St Michael The Archangel

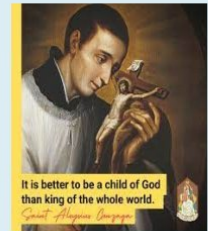

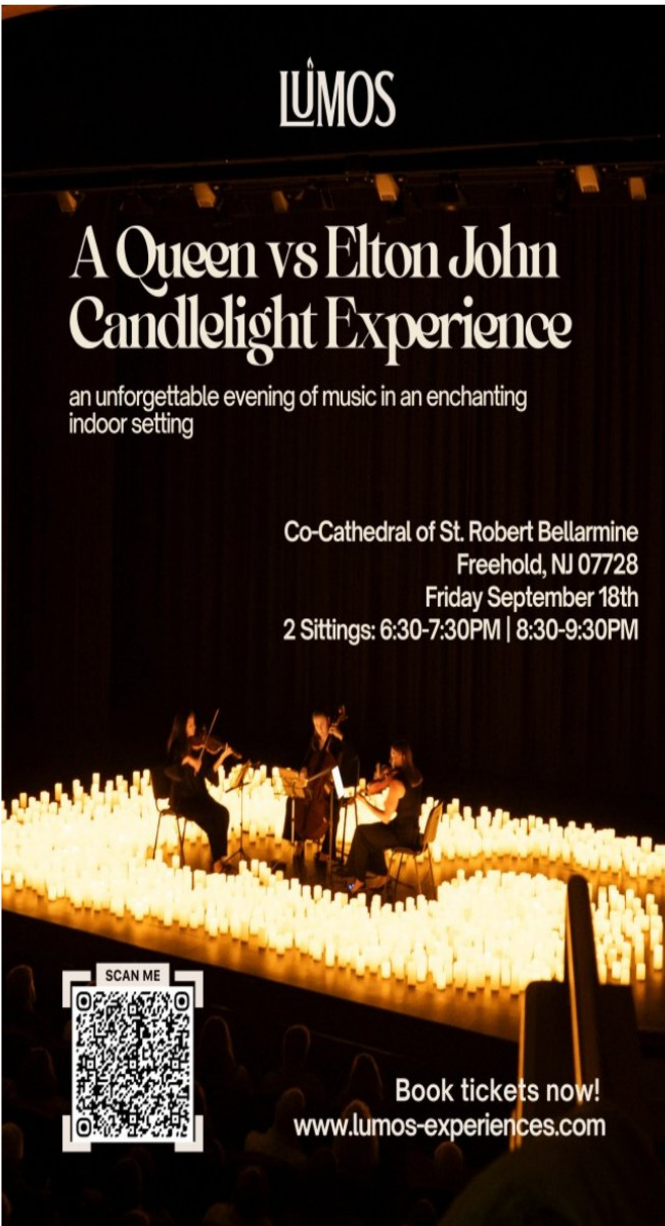

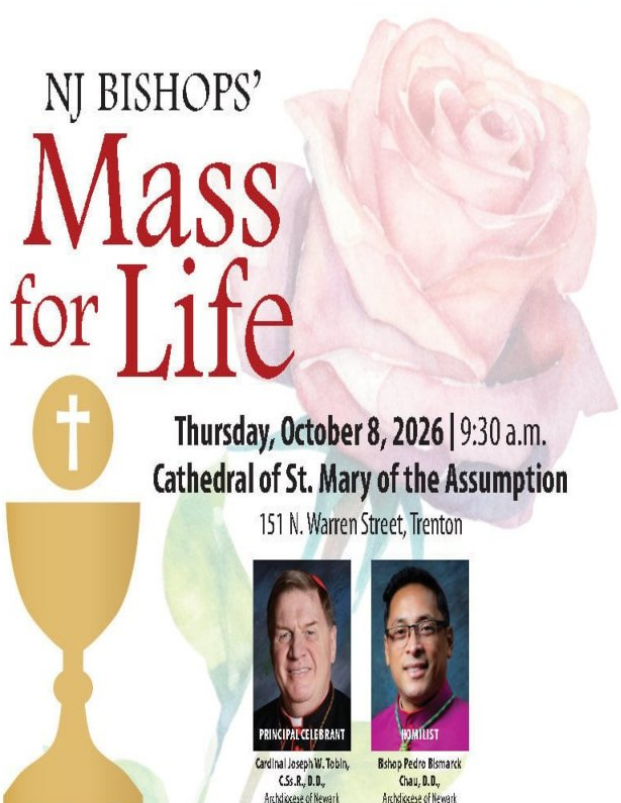
