Dear Parish Family,



The summer is coming to a fast end. With Labor Day around the corner, it seems each summer gets shorter and shorter; we need longer summers. Already, we have begun to say goodbye to some of our very talented youth involved in our Music and Youth Ministries, who are packing up to head out to college, we wish them the best!

Last Saturday was a well attended Mass for Linda Rose, who died in July. She lived in Westlake before moving to Delaware about 3 years ago, with her husband, Fred, after she retired as Vice President at Spring Point Living. While in her 80's, Linda was a very active and intelligent person, who spent most of her life in the healing arts as a nurse. She was a founding member of the Parish Health Care Ministry, an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, and a member of the Parish Finance Committee for many years. Sadly, I buried her son-inlaw, her daughter, her mother, and now Linda. Say a prayer for her that she may she rest in peace.

Maybe 1 am getting a little nostalgic now that 1 turned 60, but a lot of good people have gone to their eternal rest. I told my mother she now has a senior son! Thank you for all the well wishes, gifts, cards, and shout outs on reaching this milestone of life. Getting older is ok with me—it means I am still kicking! Maybe I have to eat more fruits, vegetables, and fiber, with less sugar, salt, and fat, but what the heck!

Last Thursday was the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day of obligation. 1 had a question asked about the feast, which may be on some folks' minds. Jesus rose from the dead, and ascended to the right hand of the Father. He promised each of us this same reality, but due to sin, we die and our bodies are interred here on earth while our soul goes to heaven (hopefully, let's stay positive!). Our bodies await the resurrection of the dead, and the ascension into heaven on the great and terrible day of Christ's return (his 2nd coming); thus, the reason we are buried facing East from whence shall come the savior, the direction of the rising sun, and the dawning of that new, eternal day. Mary, the mother of Jesus (our mother too), was without sin, her womb held the Word of Life, the Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity. She was also the first believer, and the first disciple, so it is fitting that she would be the first to receive the first fruits of Christ's Redemption, the Resurrection and Ascension. To distinguish her from Jesus, we call this Resurrection and Ascension, the Assumption. She leads, and shows the way we, too as disciples, shall follow.

Now to the question, a parishioner was traveling, and attended Mass where the priest spoke of Mary's death during the homily, then later corrected himself. I was asked why he seemed confused! Well, we do not know if Mary died or, simply ended her life by being taken body and soul into heaven. The Church simply says, "At the end of her earthly life", one early saint, Saint Epiphanius, says she was taken to heaven like the Prophet Elijah, who did not die, but went to heaven in a chariot. The early Church used the term "dormition" for end of life, meaning "falling asleep", thus, Christians were not buried in "Necropolis" (cities of the dead), but in "Cemetarios" (places of sleep). Necropoli are where the dead remain eternally, cemeteries are where the Christian dead sleep awaiting to be awakened by the Rising Son of God, on the Last Day. So, the older name for the Solemnity of the Assumption was the Dormition of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Whether Mary 'slept' or went like Elijah, is not terribly important, and better left for theologians to debate. The simple truth is, she received the first fruits of the Redemption by being assumed, body and soul, into heaven, and we see, and know what awaits us too.

Interestingly, while protestants today do not adhere to our belief about the Assumption, the early reformers, including Martin Luther, did adhere to the teaching, and did not dispute or find it odd.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
