Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Happy Labor Day Weekend! To all who labor, thank you for your contribution to the Common Good!

Our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV chose the name Leo in honor of his predecessor Pope Leo XIII. Labor Day celebrates the worker. Pope Leo XIII could one day be the patron saint of workers. His landmark Encyclical was *Rerum Novarum* (On New Things), published in 1878 and considered the foundation for the Church's social teachings.

Leo XIII was born Gioacchino Vincenzo Raffaele Luigi Pecci. He was the sixth of seven sons born into the noble Pecci family in Carpineto, Italy, on March 20, 1810. He studied theology, Canon Law, and Civil Law and had an intense interest in Science. He was inclined toward promoting the Common Good and the problems plaguing the modern world. While he studied Theology, he was uncertain what career path he might take; one of his mentors encouraged him to enter the priesthood.

He eventually entered the Church's diplomatic section and was named a Cardinal and Camerlengo of the Holy Roman Church by Blessed Pope Pius IX in August of 1877. In February 1878, Blessed Pope Pius IX passed away, and in the ensuing Conclave, Cardinal Pecci was elected on the third scrutiny, receiving 44 of the 61 ballots cast. At the time of the Conclave, the new Italian Government was contemplating taking over the Conclave to ensure the election of a Pope favorable to the latest Government (Pope Pius IX was hostile toward it). Still, the King died, and the Government was distracted. The electors chose Leo XIII as a compromise candidate, likely to avoid controversy; he was 68 and ailing, so it was unlikely he would live long. Well, he died 25 years later, on July 20, 1903; the Papacy was a tonic for his poor health. God writes straight through crooked lines!

Among the many good deeds he gave us, through his encouragement, were St. Katherine Drexel, whom he advised to found her own order, and St. Mother Francis Xavier Cabrini, who was told, "not to the East but to the West you shall go," to New York City in America. And when the teenager St. Therese of Lisieux broke Vatican protocol, shouting at him during a Papal Audience that she wanted him to allow her to enter Carmel at age 15, he responded, "If it is God's Will, you shall enter," and she did.

He wrote the Encyclical *Providentissimus Deus* on Sacred Scripture and established the Pontifical Biblical Commission, which opened the doors for Ecumenical Biblical studies. He promoted the study and use of Philosophy, particularly in his work *Aeterni Patris*, which encouraged Thomism. This led to a renewed interest in the works of St. Thomas Aquinas, which continues today. He was the first "modern" pope, the first to have his voice recorded, and the first to appear in film. He was also the youngest person ever to be photographed. C.K. Chesterton admired him and included him in his *Fr. Brown* Series.

He made the English convert from Anglicanism, and St. John Henry Newman, a Cardinal, the same man whom Pope Leo IV declared a Doctor of the Church. Leo XIII declared the Venerable Bede a Doctor of the Church.

He will be forever linked to his most tremendous success, though, *Rerum Novarum* of 1878, which reflected on Economics, Human Labor, and dignity, and most importantly, the equality of all people.

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He was a small man by stature but a giant of his time and a towering figure in the history of the Church and human history as well. He died on March 20, 1903, at the age of 93. He was a tireless worker himself and called upon those around him to match his stamina.

He used the Papacy to draw attention to the appalling working conditions of laborers and their inadequate compensation. He was and remains their champion. He is an inspiration for the ages!

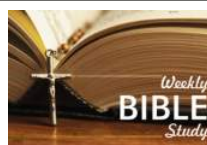


Our Walking with Purpose Bible Study is comprised of women, just like you. We
