Dear Parish Family.

This weekend as a nation, we celebrate the American Worker, the importance of work, and the importance of the dignity of the worker. When I have visitors from other countries, they marvel over several things; principally American economic enterprise, our roads, and our patriotic citizens (they see so many flags flying everywhere). American enterprise and ingenuity are the driving forces behind our successful economy, which allow Americans to enjoy such a high standard of living. This high standard of living is due to the American workers who are dedicated to their jobs.

Labor Day brings to mind the great American poet, Walt Whitman's poem, dedicated to work, called "I Hear America Singing":

"I hear America singing, the varied carols I hear,

Those of mechanics, each one singing his as it should be blithe and strong,

The carpenter singing his as he measures his plank or beam,

The mason singing his as he makes ready for work, or leaves off work,

The boatman singing what belongs to him in his boat, the deckhand singing on the steamboat deck,

The shoemaker singing as he sits on his bench, the hatter singing as he stands,

The wood-cutter's song, the ploughboy's on his way in the morning, or at noon intermission or at sundown, The delicious singing of the mother, or of the young wife at work, or of the girl sewing or washing,

Each singing what belongs to him or her and to none else,

The day what belongs to the day-at night the party of young fellows, robust, friendly,

Singing with open mouths their strong melodious songs."

While the poem may be time bound to the 18th Century in which Whitman lived, it captures the essence of the American work experience. While not every job is great, work brings dignity to the worker, gives him or her purpose, and satisfaction. In many ways whatever our work is if we sing it, it becomes satisfying. It is the rhythm of our country's workers that keeps America singing!

The Church has a rich history in her social teachings, all the modern popes have written on the dignity of the worker, and work from the ground breaking Encyclical Rerum Novarum of Pope Leo XII to Pope Francis' Ladato Si. Catholic social teaching has 4 pillars: the dignity of the human person, subsidiarity, the common good, and solidarity.

In his encyclical letter, On Care for Our Common Home (Ladato Si), Pope Francis wrote: "Work should be the setting for this rich personal growth, where many aspects of life enter into play: creativity, planning for the future, developing our talents, living out our values, relating to others, giving glory to God."

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
