


When the Trinitarian Missionary arrived for the MCP he only asked me one question, "What does your parish do very well". My immediate response was, "the parish is very generous to anyone in need." I then gave him several examples from recent memory and hailed the active work of our St. Vincent de Paul Society. I noted to him that the SVdP is our largest ministry in the parish (we have several large ministries but SVdP is the largest of the large ones). I told him this reflects the seriousness of the Christian commitment of our parishioners to works of charity that Jesus motivates us to do.

Two other very big ministries are the annual Turkey Drive coming up in November. About 7 years ago the parishioner who coordinated this herculean undertaking retired and moved out of State. At that time I asked Jim Guldner to head the drive; Jim accepted the challenge and excelled at it. Jim is now passing the baton to Dave Furbish. I want to thank Jim for the incredible coordinated work he did for the last 7 years and I am grateful to Dave for taking on the task.

Jim also headed up and coordinated the monthly food drive. Each month we collect food on the third weekend of the month. On the third Monday of the month, the food needs to be picked up and taken to the designated charity for that month. **We are looking for a new person to head up this ministry.** If you are interested, contact Pat Mulholland in the Parish Office at 732-370-0500 or parishoffice@saintaloyusonline.org. This is a once a month commitment on the third Monday for the months of January through October. We skip November and December due to the larger food drives during those months.







Children will hear the Gospel, sing songs and engage in crafts to reinforce the readings of the day. Children will be dismissed after the Opening Prayer and will return after the Prayer of the Faithful. Children should know where their parents are seated so they can find their way back upon their return. Parents are welcome to join with their children.



Have you or someone you love missed out on one or more of their sacraments? Do you know someone who wants to be Catholic? We have a fantastic community in our RCIA program led by a team of wonderful faith filled people who act as catechists and can help them prepare for the gift of encountering the Lord in the Sacraments of the Church. The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** used to be called “the Last Rites” because the usual recipient was a dying person. This sacrament is also offered for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. Please do not wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. If you or a family member would like the Anointing


