
Dear Parish Family,

A word of thanks to everyone who made Msgr. Matthias' visit comfortable and welcome. He made the long journey home on Monday to Luweero. It was bittersweet as his elder sister, Monica, died while he was here. He arrived home on Tuesday, and the funeral was on Wednesday. Thank you to all who treated him to breakfast, lunch, or dinner during his 6-week stay, and to the daily Mass attendees who were able to provide him with necessities he needed to take home; they all fit in his suitcase. Special thanks to Pat for lending an extra, wide suitcase to help us get everything back to Africa! Africans typically arrive with one small carry-on and always leave with two bags: a carry-on and a personal item! Coming to America provides an opportunity to access things that are unavailable to them. Thanks to Fr. R.J. for both picking Msgr. up at the airport, and getting him safely there on Labor Day. A community effort!

Labor Day was an opportunity to recall the contributions of the Catholic Church to Social Teaching and Human Labor. The Father of Catholic Social Teaching is Pope Leo XIII. Pope Leo XIII emphasized the common good as the ultimate goal of society and government, arguing that authority comes from God and must serve the people's well-being by promoting social order, justice, and charity through both state and associative action. In his landmark encyclical *Rerum Novarum*, he sought a middle path between liberalism and socialism, supporting private property rights while calling for a living wage, worker organization, and state intervention for the poor to ensure they could thrive. He also highlighted the importance of individual dignity, solidarity, and the subsidiarity principle, where minor associations contribute to the common good at their own level.

Leo XIII envisioned a society where the state creates the conditions for ordinary people to thrive and provides assistance in emergencies, while recognizing and supporting the voluntary efforts of individuals and organizations to meet social needs. His teachings remain foundational to Catholic Social Teaching, providing a timeless framework for addressing social and economic challenges. Every Pope after Leo XVIII has added to the Canon of Catholic Social Teaching. It is anticipated that his namesake, Pope Leo XIV, will also, at some future date, continue to build on the Social Teachings of the Church. Pope Leo XIV greatly admired Pope Leo XIII, which is why he chose the name Leo. There is much to admire in Leo XIII; he denounced socialism and called on Catholics to reject it wholesale, he sent St. Catherine Drexel home to serve the poor, directed St. Francis Xavier Cabrini to America and not China, He elevated the convert Fr. John Henry Newman to a Cardinal, and now Pope Leo XIV will declare Newman a Doctor of the Church.






Meetings will be held Thursdays at 7pm in Morello Hall beginning October 2nd. We look forward to meeting you!




