Dear Parish Family-

'Tis the season for returning to School! Best wishes to all those starting or returning to school at whatever academic level. May the new school year be one of wisdom, understanding and growth.

Several questions have arisen in regard to the roofs. Several months ago we hired a roofing consultant, J.D. Cummings, to do an evaluation of the New Church roof, Gonzaga Hall roof, Old Office Building roof and garage roof. All of them were found to be in need of replacing, no surprise there since they all leak. The Old Office and Garage roofs are pretty straight forward. Gonzaga Hall was found to have 3 roofs, the top roof shingles failed due to two layers below them that caused premature failure.

The church roof is quite another matter due to the rather unique shape and the many stresses due to the design. A synthetic material has been recommended for the New Church that will more or less match the current standing seam roof in color and design. The synthetic roof will have the same 'rib' seams that you see now only they will not be seams, they will be decorative. The company assures me these will not become distorted over time from weather. I was concerned they would distort over time but they assure me they have used them on other projects with equally challenging roof designs and they have remained straight.

Currently we are in the design phase; the consulting company is designing the new roof systems, preparing bid documentation and preparing for a competitive bidding process. The consultant will provide all the technical materials, drawings and schedules. They will oversee bidding and manage the roof replacement process from start to finish. When we move to the next phase I'll provide updated information.

You may also see a lot of activity and contractors around the physical plant of the old parish offices and the school. We are in the process of collaborating with another institution that is in line with our mission as a Parish. They are preparing these areas to be suitable for their use. More information will be provided as we progress on this partnership.

Rumors, innuendo, gossip, slander and calumny are all destructive. They are meant to be corrosive and hurtful, they are evil and used to divide, demean and denounce the worth of individuals or institutions. They are used by weak, fearful people who seek self-gratification and are power hungry due to their powerlessness. They like to start fires and then watch them burn, in a word, evil. I mention this because there are swirling rumors about St. Aloysius Church having been sold to the Orthodox Jewish Community, our Jewish relatives do not buy Churches and ours is not, has not and will not be up for sale to anyone. The Orthodox have not sought to rent, lease, or otherwise occupy in any way, shape or form, our spaces.

In August we fielded calls from people looking for sacramental records from St. Veronica's Church in Howell! Why? The callers insisted St. Veronica had been sold to the Orthodox and was closed. Why they would call us for St. Veronica records is beyond me but they did. When informed St. Veronica was open and operating, they insisted we were incorrect and they had it on "good authority" it was closed!!! When asked who the "Good Authority" was, there was hesitation and stuttering! The answer was again, we were wrong and they had it on "good authority". Where is this authorities headquarters? Baseball fields, soccer fields, dance studio's, karate courses, Shop Rite, school parking lots, Community Clubhouses and the like...hardly authoritative places, simply rumor mills and nothing more.

Moral of the story, don't believe everything you hear on a field, studio, supermarket, clubhouse or parking lot gossip center! If I had a dime for every rumor about our demise or 'takeover', I could pay off the 3 mortgages, re-roof all our buildings, repave the parking lot, change the outdoor lighting to LED, build a solar array, fix the electrical/HVAC problems in the Church, and make a huge investment in the Stock Market and still have money left over!!!!

We are here, St. Veronica's is in Howell and God is in his Holy Heaven! Peace and Good – Fr. Bambrick

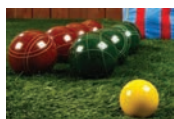

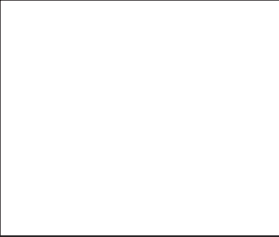
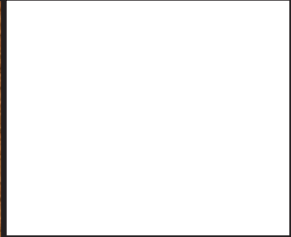
