Dear Parish Family,

On Friday, the nation marked the 25th anniversary of the cowardly al Qaeda terrorist attacks on innocent civilian non-combatants on September 11, 2001. American Airlines Flight 11 was hijacked and flown into the North Tower (1 World Trade Center) in New York City at 8:46 a.m. United Airlines Flight 175 was hijacked and flown into the South Tower (2 World Trade Center) in New York City at 9:03 a.m. American Airlines Flight 77 was hijacked and flown into the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia at 9:37 a.m. United Airlines Flight 93 was hijacked, but passengers and crew bravely fought back against the hijackers. The plane crashed in a rural field near Shanksville, Pennsylvania, at 10:03 a.m., preventing it from hitting its intended target in Washington, D.C.

The most famous song of that time was by Country Singer Alan Jackson entitled "Where Were You When The World Stopped Turning". The chorus verse was a fitting rebuke to the terrorists who claim to have done it in the name of God: "I know Jesus and I talk to God, and I remember this from when I was young, Faith, hope and love are some good things He gave us, And the greatest is love, And the greatest is love, And the greatest is love. Where were you when the world stopped turning on that September day?"

Many of us who were alive in 2001 remember exactly where we were and what we were doing. I had just finished morning Mass on a clear, blue-sky day when someone told me a plane had crashed into one of the Twin Towers. I went to the Parish House and turned on CNN, arriving just in time to see the second plane hit the other tower. Soon after, there were reports of a plane crashing into the Pentagon and the downing of Flight 93 in Shanksville. Outside, the air was quiet, and later, fighter jets flew overhead as the airspace was closed. I remember the men who attended daily Mass wishing another parishioner a good trip out west to go hiking; he was on Flight 93. In total, 11 men from our town died, 9 from our parish. We held three funerals for 9/11 victims in one day, with the rest scheduled for other days. One non-Catholic victim's church was too small for the crowd, so we offered our church for their funeral.

After the initial fear of war on our own soil, anger and resentment followed, but then came resolve and unity. Suddenly, differences didn't matter as people became more religious and cared more for their neighbors. Compassion and kindness were everywhere. As Charles Dickens wrote in the opening lines of "A Tale of Two Cities": "It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair."

Although a terrible evil was inflicted upon the innocent, it produced a springtime of kindness, memorials appeared everywhere, and many wanted a piece of the Twin Towers for their memorials. I received a Cross made from the ruins. It was the worst of times but it also brought about the best in the human and American spirit. May we never forget and never yield to terror or tyranny. Let us always remember the good things God gave us, the greatest of these are faith, hope and love.

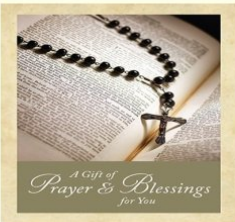

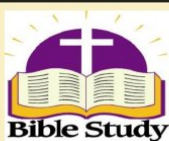


Prayer to St Michael The Archangel

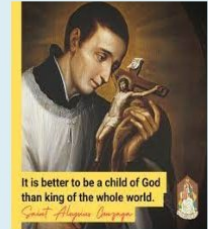

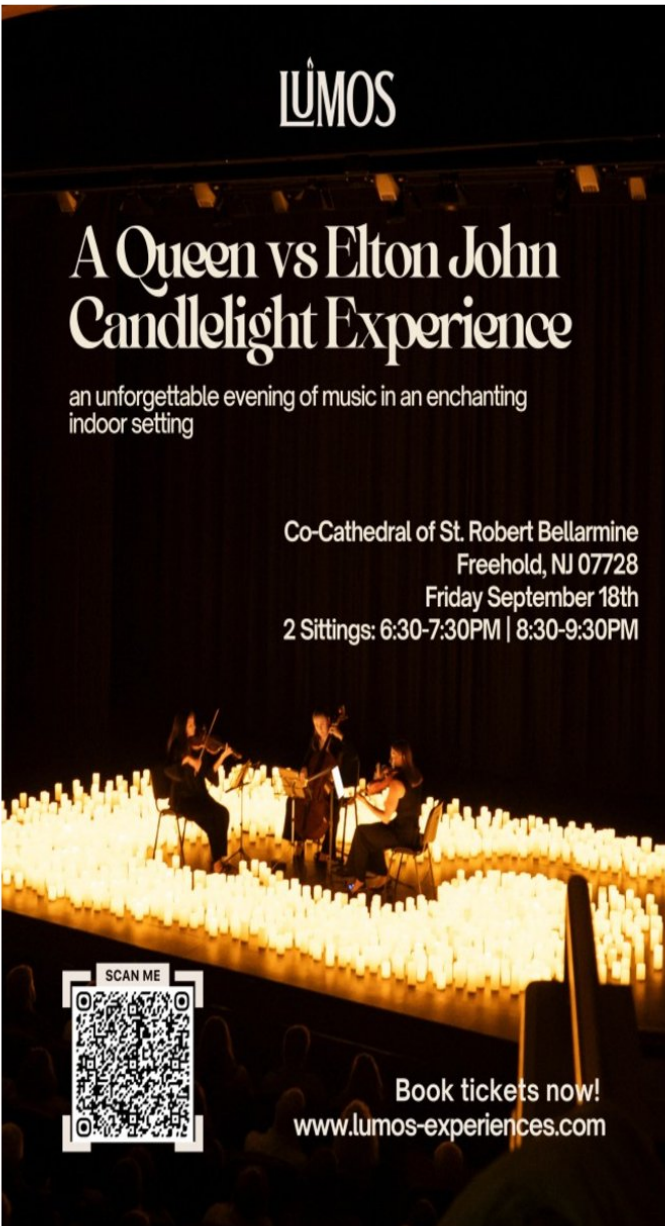
