

Dear Parish Family-

For most of my life, as a layman and a priest, I have lived in mixed communities of Christians and Jews. I have publically wished my Jewish neighbors a happy holiday, to the dismay of some. As we approach the Jewish High Holy Days, Rosh Hashanah (Sept. 15-17), Yom Kippur (Sept. 24-15) and Sukkot (Sept. 29-Oct. 6), we should joyfully wish our Jewish neighbors Happy Holidays.



This year it is all the more salient for us as Catholics because on Dec. 17, 2022 Pope Francis issued a decree for the Beatification of the Ulma Family to take place on Sept. 10 in Markowa Poland, just before the start of the Jewish High Holy Days.

Who, you might wonder, are the Ulma Family? The Ulma family lived in Nazi occupied Poland in the village of Markowa in South East Poland. The parents were Wiktoria (31) and Jozef Ulma (44), they had six children; Stanislawa, age 8; Barbara, age 7; Wladyslaw, age 6; Franciszek, aged 4; Antoni, aged 3 and, Maria, aged 2. Wiktoria was 7 months pregnant at the time of their martyrdom and when she was shot her water broke and she gave birth to a child who was then shot by the Nazis. All 9 members of the family were shot outside their home on March 24, 1944.

What was this devout Catholic Family's crime? The family bible had only one passage underlined in red pen, Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan. The Ulmas were known to be people who would help anyone who came to their door. The 'crime' that cost them their lives was the hiding of 8 Jewish people in the attic of their home in rural Poland. Though a large and not prosperous family, they hid and cared for 8 more people during the war. When the Ulmas were denounced, the 8 Jewish people were also shot outside their home.

This is the first time in the history of the Church that an entire family will be beatified together. The family consisted of 9 members, one of which was not baptized but will be beatified as the Church considers martyrdom to be a baptism by blood. They are a model of the living out of the teaching of the Torah, love God and your neighbor, which Jesus commanded us to follow. They perfectly lived out the Golden Rule of Christianity. They hid their innocent Jewish neighbors and paid the ultimate price in blood for their faith, hope and love.

As we all know, tensions exist within our community due to our new Orthodox Jewish neighbors. The Ulmas provide the answer to the diffusing of those tensions, simply live the Golden Rule, fulfill the command of the Torah, love God and your neighbor, this is the first and greatest command of God's Holy Law.


The decision of Pope Francis to include the unnamed 7th child of the Ulmas also speaks volumes to us of the sanctity of human life from conception to natural death; the sacredness of life even in the womb.

May the Ulma's example and beatification so close to the Jewish High Holy Days give us the strength of our shared faith to love our God and our neighbors with courage. Wish your Jewish neighbors a happy holiday, it won't cost you your life, no one will shoot you but, you may make a friend.






