Dear Parish Family-

Last weekend I wrote a brief explanation of a Synod and the Holy Father's decision to open the 2023 World Synod of Bishop's to broad consultation to the whole Church throughout the world in three phases. The Diocesan Phase beginning Oct. 17 and running through April of 2022, the Regional Phase meaning the Episcopal Conferences (ours being the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops or USCCB) and finally the Ordinary Synod of Bishop's at the Universal level in 2023.

Remember Synod comes to us from the Greek meaning, "Walking together" the shared pilgrimage we make together as baptized persons moving in this life ever toward Jesus. The Holy Father has emphasized this Synodal process as one of 'Listening' to God (especially the third person of the Most Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit) one another and our shared experience of faith. It is a Spiritual process at work to reform the Church.

The theme of the 2023 Ordinary Synod is: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission." This theme is a reminder that by Baptism we are brought into Communion with Christ and one another, as the preparatory document for the Synod reminds us, "we realized that no one is saved alone; we can only be saved together" The second part of the theme reminds us we are all invited to Participation in the work of the Synod. The preparatory document emphasizes the Holy Father's wish to have as broad a consultation as possible of ALL the Baptized, laity and clergy, it says, "in the hope of helping to set in motion the ideas, energy, and creativity of all those who will take part in the journey, and to make it easier to share the fruits of their efforts". The third part of the theme is a concentration on Mission; Jesus has sent us out on a Mission to Proclaim the Gospel, the Good News. The Preparatory Document emphases, "*everyone has something to learn. The faithful people, the college of bishops, the Bishop of Rome: all listening to each other*"

Why does the Holy Father want such broad consultation? The answer is found in the Preparatory Document, *"The Council (Vatican II) emphasized how, by virtue of the anointing of the Holy Spirit received in Baptism, the totality of the Faithful "cannot err in matters of belief. They manifest this special property by means of the whole Peoples' supernatural discernment in matters of faith when 'from the Bishops down to the last of the lay Faithful' they show universal agreement in matters of faith and morals" (LG, no. 12). It is the Spirit who guides the faithful "to all truth" (Jn 16:13). Through action of the Spirit, "this tradition which comes from the Apostles develops in the Church" so that the People of God may grow "in the understanding of the realities and the words which have been handed down. This happens through the contemplation and study made by believers, who treasure these things in their hearts (cf. Lk 2:19, 51) through a penetrating understanding of the spiritual realities which they experience, and through the preaching of those who have received through Episcopal succession the sure gift of truth" (DV, no. 8). In fact, this People, gathered together by its Pastors, adheres to the sacred deposit of the Word of God entrusted to the Church, perseveres constantly in the teaching of the Apostles, in fraternal communion, in the breaking of bread, and in prayer, "so that holding to, practicing, and professing the heritage of the faith, it becomes on the part of the Bishops and Faithful a single common effort" (DV, no. 10).*

The Pastors, established by God as “authentic guardians, interpreters and witnesses of the Faith of the whole Church,” should not be afraid to listen to the Flock entrusted to them. The consultation of the People of God does not imply the assumption within the Church of the dynamics of democracy based on the principle of majority, because there is, at the basis of participation in every synodal process, a shared passion for the common mission of evangelization and not the representation of conflicting interests. In other words, this is an ecclesial process that can only take place “at the heart of a hierarchically structured community.” It is in the fruitful bond between the sensus fidei of the People of God and the magisterial function of the Pastors that the unanimous consensus of the whole Church in the same faith is realized. Every synodal process, in which the Bishops are called to discern what the Spirit is saying to the Church, not by themselves but by listening to the People of God, who “shares also in Christ’s prophetic office” (LG, no. 12), is an evident form of that “journeying together” which makes the Church grow. St. Benedict emphasizes how “the Lord often reveals the most prudent course to be followed” in the community (in that case, the youngest); thus, the Bishops should take care to reach out to everyone, so that, in the orderly unfolding of the synodal journey, what the apostle Paul recommends to the communities may be realized: “Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophetic utterances. Test everything; retain what is good” (1 Thess 5:19-21).

A Synod is primarily about listening to what God is saying to each of us individually and communally to fulfill the mission Jesus has entrusted to us. What a Synod is not is a democratic process where the majority rules, it is not a complaint session, it is not about changing dogma or doctrine but as Vatican II says, “scrutinize the signs of the times and interpret them in the light of the Gospel” (GS, no. 4). It is about opening ourselves to the Holy Spirit, *“listening to the Holy Spirit, who like the wind “blows where it wills; you can hear the sound it makes, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes” (Jn 3:8), remaining open to the surprises that the Spirit will certainly prepare for us along the way. Thus, dynamism is activated that allows us to begin to reap some of the fruits of a synodal conversion, which will progressively mature. These are objectives of great importance for the quality of ecclesial life and for accomplishing the mission of evangelization, in which we all participate by virtue of our Baptism and Confirmation.*

The Preparatory Document sets before us what it calls “The Fundamental Questions” which each of us must ask ourselves and discern together for the good of the whole Church, it says:

*The fundamental question that guides this consultation of the People of God...is the following:
A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, “journeys together:” How is this “journeying together” happening today in your particular Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our “journeying together”?*

In order to respond, you are invited to:

- A) Ask yourselves what experiences in your particular Church the fundamental question calls to mind;*
- B) Reread these experiences in greater depth: What joys did they provoke? What difficulties and obstacles have they encountered ? What wounds have they brought to light? What insights have they elicited?*
- C) Gather the fruits to share: Where, in these experiences, does the voice of the Spirit resound? What is he asking of us? What are the points to be confirmed, the prospects for change, the steps to be taken? Where do we register a consensus? What paths are opening up for our particular Church?*

These will be the essential building blocks needed to build a consensus among God's people for the Ordinary Synod of Bishops in 2023.

If you remember nothing of what I have written, remember the Church needs your spiritually mature prayerful reflections for this movement to bear fruit. Be open to the movement of the Holy Spirit in your reflections, pray on these fundamental questions and be ready, as the Apostle Peter urges us, "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope". (1Peter 3:15)


