Dear Parish Family,

In July, the Congregation of the Mission visited us for the MCP. St. Vincent de Paul founded this group in 1625. In 1617, he started the Ladies of Charity to assist him in serving poor slaves in galleys. This later led to the founding of the Daughters of Charity with the help of St. Louise de Marillac. St. Vincent dePaul dedicated his life to helping the poor and inspired others to do the same.



Popes Benedict and Francis have both reminded us that people are converted more by our actions than by our words. Sometimes words can be empty, but our example shows what we truly believe. This was certainly true for St. Vincent de Paul. People said he transformed the face of France by his charity work. He is known as the Patron Saint of all charitable works.

Today we speak of a 'Vincentian Family'. Many organizations, communities and religious orders were either founded by or inspired by St. Vincent de Paul.

After the Congregation of the Mission and the Daughters of Charity, the most well-known group is the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. It was founded in May of 1833 by Blessed Frederic Ozanam, a layman and student in Paris. Pope St. John Paul II beatified him at Notre Dame in Paris in 1997, and his feast day is September 9. Blessed Frederic Ozanam was born in Milan, Italy, raised in Lyon, France, and studied at the Sorbonne in Paris. There, he and other young men started the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, inspired by St. Vincent de Paul's example. He died at the age of 40, leaving behind a widow, a daughter, and 2,000 members in the Society he founded. People said he was *"a man of great faith. He valued friendships and defended his friends no matter what the cost. He was attentive to details, perhaps to the extreme. ... [H]e showed a great tenderness when dealing with his family. ... He had a great reverence for his parents, and revealed his ability to sacrifice his career and his profession in order to please them."*

Today, the St. Vincent de Paul Societies have grown to over 800,000 members, a far cry from the 2,000 at Blessed Frederic's death! The Society works mainly through conferences in Catholic Parishes. The Society runs 48,000 conferences worldwide in 155 countries, with over 1.5 million volunteers helping 30 million people each day. Rather impressive for a volunteer Christian charity that began in the slums of Paris.

Here in Jackson, we have a joint conference of St. Aloysius and St. Monica, which is one of the 48,000 conferences serving those in need. Each conference is responsible for a geographic area, helping all of God's poor locally and supporting other conferences when needed. Together, they form a strong safety net for the poor. Next Sunday, our conference members will renew their commitment to the works of charity in the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and to living out the Vincentian spirit in our community. This will take place next Sunday at the 8:30am Mass.

The Conference is also holding a fundraiser in partnership with Boscov's "Friends Helping Friends". They are selling 25% off coupons for \$5.00, and all proceeds will go to our Conference. The coupon is valid for one day only, on Wednesday October 21, 2026, from 8am to 11pm, both in store or online. Volunteers from the Society will be selling the coupons next weekend, as well as on the weekend of October 4th and 10th at all Masses or through the parish office.

Please support the important work of our St. Vincent de Paul Society Conference.

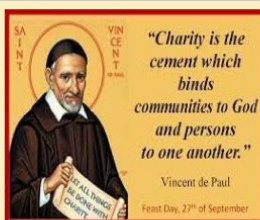
