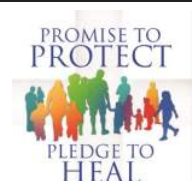

Dear Parish Family,

Last week in this space some interesting demographics were covered. This week I would like to share with you some information regarding those no longer practicing the Catholic faith. While they may no longer be associated with the Church for various reasons they still often show up at our door for one reason or another. They make up the largest group of Catholics in the County.



The following is from the Catholic Leadership Roundtable:

New data released this summer from the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) center is giving more insight into religious affiliation, and showing that there is nuance to those who disaffiliate, identifying both deep lingering connections to the Catholic faith and an emerging subgroup that is offering hope to Church leaders: cultural Catholics.

47% of U.S. adults have a personal or family connection to Catholicism.

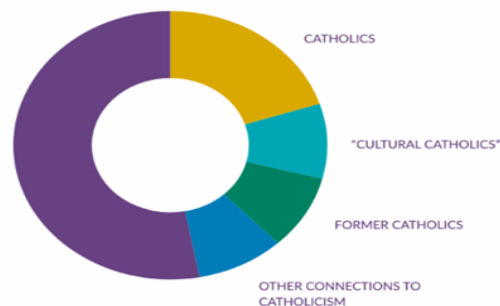
HERE'S THE BREAKDOWN:

Of U.S. adults:

- 20% are Catholics
- 9% are "cultural Catholics"
- 9% are former Catholics
- 9% have other connections to Catholicism

The remaining 53% of U.S. adults report no connection to Catholicism.

PEW RESEARCH CENTER



Pew's latest study found that 47 percent of U.S. adults report to have some connection to Catholicism. Among those, 20 percent identify as fully Catholic. The rest, evenly split at 9 percent each, identify as one of three other groups:

1. *Those who left the religion and no longer identify with it, but did previously.*
2. *Those who do not identify as Catholic but are connected to the faith through a parent, spouse, or family member.*
3. *"Cultural Catholics," which Pew defines as "those who do not identify as Catholic in terms of their religion", but say "yes" when asked because they consider themselves Catholic in other ways, for example, ethnically, culturally, or because of their family background.*

For Church leaders, cultural Catholics offer a unique evangelical opportunity. In 2015, Pew found that a large portion, 43 percent, of cultural Catholics, said "yes" when asked if they would consider returning to the faith. That suggests that there is hope for Church leaders working to re-engage the U.S. Catholics who have

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disengaged but still identify as “culturally” Catholic. Pew’s latest data led the study’s authors to conclude that the roots of Catholicism run deep in America.

Catholicism’s deep roots grew in America due in large part to the social work of the Church in the 19th and 20th centuries. Frequently, the Church was the only institution serving those most in need, offering a sense of care and love that government assistance did not. To engage cultural Catholics, Dr. Maureen K. Day, theologian and author, urge Church leaders to return to the work that helped grow America’s Catholic roots as one way to re-engage them in faith life. “
