THE DIOCESE OF TRENTON is committed to the initiatives outlined in the U.S. Bishop's Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People and to its own policies and guidelines in regard to the reporting and investigation of sexual abuse allegations involving minors.

The Diocese of Trenton reports any allegations of sexual abuse to the appropriate law enforcement agencies. Anyone with an allegation is also encouraged to provide that information to local law enforcement authorities.

Dear Parish Family,

From Tuesday through Thursday, September 10-12, I and Fr. RJ were at the annual Convocation of Priests with Bishop O'Connell. The Bishop shared with the priests the most recent statistics for our Diocese, and I thought you might also like to know what is happening around our Diocese. Here is the bishop's report on the state of the diocese:

- 1. There are 97 parishes in the Diocese, some of which are the result of past mergers, while others are as they were at their establishment. Some have multiple worship sites or "church buildings" still in use. (thirty years ago we had 127 parishes).
- 2. The four counties of the Diocese together have a total population of 2,130,044. Of that number, 640,000 are registered Catholics. (down from 800,000 ten years ago).
- 3. There are 166 priests incardinated in the Diocese and 30 priests belonging to religious institutes or other dioceses, 2 belonging to the Red Bank Oratory. There are 78 retired priests including 12 who are disabled. A number of retirees have remained active, helping at parishes.
- 4. There are 52 International priests in the Diocese; the largest national groups are from the Philippines and Columbia. Other countries represented are Poland, India, Haiti, Ireland, Korea, and 1 each in Nigeria, Uganda, Brazil, Ecuador and Peru.
- 5. Religious Orders of Men: Trinitarians, Dominicans, SVD, OFM Conventual, OFM, Redemptorists, Christian Brothers.
- 6. There are 253 permanent deacons in the Diocese: 188 active and 65 of whom are retired. There is 1 transitional deacon scheduled to be ordained a priest on May 31, 2025. There are 19 candidates for the permanent diaconate, 9 to be ordained in 2026 and 10 in 2027. The course of studies has been reduced from 5 to 4 years. The Diocese and Seton Hall administer their formation.
- 7. There are 19 consecrated religious brothers, and 39 consecrated religious women residing in the Diocese of Trenton. Most are retired.
- 8. There are 9 Diocesan seminarians in the Diocese: 6 at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary, 3 at
- St. Charles Seminary, and 2 in the Red Bank Oratory, studying at Seton Hall.
- 9. There are 31 Catholic elementary schools (8,714 students), 9 Catholic high schools (5,145 students) and 1 Catholic university (1,962).
- 10. There are approximately 32,061 children in parish religious education programs.
- 11. There are 162 catechumens.
- 12. Sacraments: Baptism: 6088; Confirmation: 5122; First Communion: 4826; Marriage: 1120; Funerals: numbers not recorded; Annulments: 79 formal process completed; 70 new formal process accepted; 83 lack of form granted.





In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
