Dear Parish Family-

On Saturday, September 10th the Religious Teachers Filippini, a Congregation of Women Religious, celebrated the 350th Anniversary of the Birth of their founder, St. Lucy Filippini, at their Mother House in Morristown. The Filippini Sisters were founded by St. Lucy Filippini to educate young girls and this remains their central mission. They teach around the globe gathering sisters who had been missioned in far flung places of the globe. Here, in the United States, at the beginning of the 20th Century, around 1909, a group of sisters were sent from Italy to Trenton, New Jersey. Their first foundation was at St. Joachim Parish in Trenton. They expanded beyond our Diocese when Bishop Thomas Walsh was made Archbishop of Newark and their Mother House was moved to Morristown from Trenton; it is now in the Diocese of Paterson (The Paterson Diocese was created from a portion of the Archdiocese of Newark at a later time). The Sister's honored Bishop, later Archbishop, Walsh's patronage by naming their Provincial House in Morristown 'Villa Walsh', the name it still retains. Archbishop Walsh was Irish, however, he had spent many years in Rome before becoming Bishop of Trenton and was a fluent Italian speaker. He knew the good work of the Maestre Pie, as they are formally known, from his time in Italy. The Sisters still teach in our Diocese, in fact our former Parochial Vicar, Fr. Sheldon Amasa, was also at the celebration as they teach in the school where he is now pastor.

At the Mass Bishop Arthur Serritelli, retired Bishop of Paterson, preached the homily and was the principal celebrant of the Mass. Bishop Serritelli is one of America's foremost Scripture scholars and a prolific writer. He taught Scripture at Immaculate Conception Seminary in South Orange for many decades before being chosen as a Bishop. He was an excellent professor and homilist.

Bishop Serritelli noted in his homily that the most frequently used title used for Jesus in the Scriptures is "Teacher", no other title or descriptor comes close to the use of 'teacher' to describe him in the Bible. When the Bishop rhetorically asked, "Do you know what title is used for Jesus more than any other in the Bible", before he could answer all the Sisters present in the chapel said out loud, "TEACHER" to which the Bishop responded most happily "Correct".

On September 11th the Westlake Community here in Jackson held their wonderful and packed 9-11 commemoration. One of the speakers spoke of the importance of teachers in our world and how important they are for the future of America, for the development of the young mind.

Over the same weekend, I heard from some teachers who struggle with the new curriculum being mandated by the Socialist Left in our country, how difficult they find it and how some of it is inappropriate for young minds and unnecessary in an academic setting.

I mention all of this, not to get into the national debate about curriculum, but as a reminder of how important teaching is and how teaching it is central to our life as Catholics. Bishops and Pastors are mandated by the Church to "Teach, Sanctify and Govern", take note of the three, "Teach" is the first.

The weekend of September 11th brought back many memories of good teachers. At the dinner following the Mass on Saturday, one of the priests asked me, "What kind of teacher was Bishop Serritelli?" My response was "the best, he was a brilliant teacher, he communicated complex ideas in a way we could understand them, he was beloved by his students and well liked."

Teachers have a great influence on our development as human beings. Yes, there are bad teachers and we have all experienced them. Usually we only think of them in passing. Good teachers remain with us because they formed us. Great teachers continue to form us, like Jesus. They say, to teach is to touch eternity, this is true.

As the academic world comes back to life in September, let us not fail to forget those who teach. On Sunday, September 11th, the speaker included teachers in his list of heroes and called them First Responders and indeed they are in many ways the first of the first responders. They first respond to our young (and not so young) helping us to understand, to seek clarification, to grow in knowledge. Many of them instill in us a thirst to always be learning. One of my best principals, Michele Williams, whom many of you know, was fond of repeating "we are lifelong learners". May it ever be so and thank you to all those who teach in imitation of Jesus the Great Teacher!






