Dear Parish Family,

On Monday, September 23rd through Wednesday, September 25th, work was completed on a new lighting control system for the Church, the old one having burned out from a power surge on Holy Thursday in March. This will allow us to turn on only sections at a time instead of all the lighting, saving energy as well as extending the life of many of the light bulbs. After the power surge, all the lighting was rewired into a single breaker, the upshot of that was all the chandeliers, and a few other lights, worked again after being non-functional; however, it is never a good idea to control all your lighting using breakers.

Two weeks ago the New Jersey State Police and the Department of Homeland Security did a thorough security and risk assessment of our parish facilities. This is a service the government offers to houses of worship and schools. They gave us some oral recommendations immediately, and will issue a full written report on recommended changes to the facility. The State and Federal Government offer the possibility of grants to assist with the more expensive changes. Over the course of the coming year, you may see some changes occurring on our property in response to the recommendations. There will be other changes you will not see or be aware of in the coming year. There will be no advance notice, nor will we be advertising these changes for, well, security reasons! So the ones you see, and don't like, will be made based on the report we receive, and are for the good and safety of everyone.

Believe it or not, our parking lot is a very active place, especially after dark. All sorts of illegal and immoral things go on in this holy place, not that some of it does not occur during the day, for indeed it does. Thankfully, the Jackson Police Department is very helpful and responsive when these things are brought to their attention. Some are also destructive, and others plain dangerous, such as speeding, racing, etc.

One of the more dangerous things which occur on a daily basis, are cars trying to avoid the traffic light at Bennetts Mills Road and County Line Road (admittedly, it is a crazy intersection), Post Office patrons using our driveway as a parking lot, thus blocking emergency service vehicles and buses trying to enter the property and, cars barreling at high speeds from County Line Road to Bates Road, endangering the students at Alpha School, and anyone else daring to cross our private road. The Alpha School has hired security guards to re-direct traffic during student pick-up and drop-off hours for the safety of their student body.

Safety has become a priority, and changes are on the way.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.





with collecting and sorting donations before and after each of those Masses. Stay tuned for more info in the coming weeks!






