Dear Parish Family-

I wish to express my heartfelt thanks to everyone for their kindness to me, my mother, sister, niece and nephew at the death of my father. Whether you had a Mass offered, you prayed a Rosary for him (his favorite prayer), offered a prayer, left a kind message, sent a sympathy card, attended the wake or the funeral, helped out with the music ministry or made a memorial donation to St. Mary's Seminary, we say thank you. My father died very peacefully at home surrounded by his family, what better death could one ask for at the end of life? He was a very devout Catholic, while Alzheimers Disease robbed him of much; he remembered his prayers to the end. He was buried during Holy Week, a most solemn time of the year just at the cusp of Easter Joy! May he share in the life of the Risen Lord.

When we were growing up my father emphasized with us the necessity to always have a care for the poor and less fortunate, this was not just a catechetical theory, he often took us along to bring food and other items to people in need or asked us to give one of our toys to someone who needed one. His charity was bound as one with his faith. I have tried as a priest to have the care of the poor as a priority.

This Easter as a parish we are taking part in assisting the "Blessing Bag Brigade" by providing Blessing Bags for the homeless and those living in various shelters. I am pleased to say, as is usual for our parish family, the response has been resounding! The deadline for drop off is this Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday. If you forgot, we will gladly accept bags through the end of the week in the gathering space of the Church.

As of Monday, April 11th, we had already received 77 complete Blessing Bags along with extra items; 121 Razors, 14 Bottles of 16.9 fl. Oz. water, 8 bottles of 12 fl. Oz water, 30 toothbrushes, large assortment of soaps, 100 deodorants, and one first aid kit. By Monday, April 18th, we have already collected 75 complete Blessing Bags; I do not have a count of the miscellaneous items. The total number of bags already collected and distributed is 152. When the project is complete I will give you the new totals. These bags were very much needed now so thank you for the effort and participating in this Corporal Work of Mercy for Divine Mercy Sunday!

Traditional Mass Catechesis by Fr. Jim The Altar and the Sanctuary

The word **altar** comes from the Latin *altus*, which means “high thing.” Different church architecture accentuates this height in different ways, but most commonly by a raised floor. That is why one must ascend three steps to reach our altar. These three steps represent the theological virtues of Faith, Hope, and Charity. They also mark the threshold between the **nave**, or body, of the church, and the **sanctuary**, or Holy Place.

The altar must be consecrated with an **altar stone** in the center, containing the relics of a saint. Our altar contains the relics of our parish patron St. Aloysius. The altar top, or **mensa**, must be covered with at least one white linen cloth, two candles, and a crucifix. For a Sunday Mass or Holyday of Obligation, six candles are used, a seventh being added if the Diocesan Bishop celebrates. The **antependium**, or frontal, is the decorative cloth that hangs in front of the altar matching the color of the priestly vestments. The adornment of the altar reflects the solemnity of the day.

At St. Aloysius church, we now have the **altar of repose**, which provides a noble setting for the **tabernacle**. In this precious home, the consecrated Hosts are kept reserved for the priests and ministers to bring communion to the sick or home bound as well as for those who visit the church to adore Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. The **sanctuary lamp** is kept burning at all times near the altar of repose to remind us that Christ is present in the tabernacle. Out of reverence for the True Presence, all who cross in front of the tabernacle are to genuflect, or if unable, to at least bow.

- Please enclose a self-addressed STAMPED envelope or provide an email address so that we may notify you of the days and times assigned.
- We regret that once the Mass book is filled, we cannot accommodate any additional requests. Any request we cannot honor will be returned along with the stipend. However, the Annual Enrollment and Masses said at St. Mary's Seminary will always be available.

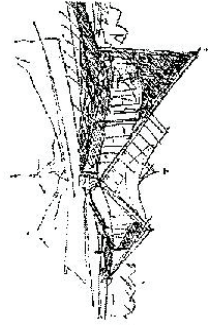
