Dear Parish Family,

Last week Cardinal McElroy, of the San Diego Diocese, banned parishes and Catholic Institutions in the Diocese of San Diego from hosting home school cooperatives. His reasoning was questionable; he gave two reasons. The first he said was the Church, and not parents are the first educators of children, and the second reason was they compete with Catholic Schools. His first reason is patently false, the Code of Canon Law, The Catechism of the Catholic Church, and our Sacramental Theology all state parents are the first educators. At the end of the week, he reversed his first reason complying with Church teaching that parents are the primary educators of their children. His second reason was suspect since Catholic Schools in San Diego are at nearly 100% capacity; it seems home school programs are not stealing away families from Catholic Schools. He did not reverse course on his second stated reason, in fact adding to it that "homeschooling is not inherently a ministry of the parish" and, therefore, cannot be given space in a Church institution. While that is true on face value, the Church does support the right of parents to choose whatever educational system they feel would be best for their child. The Diocese of San Diego allows many groups to meet on parish grounds, which are not "inherently" ministries of the parish. Some parishes enable all kinds of groups, particularly non-profits or all volunteer groups to use Church grounds.

Homeschooling is one of many educational options available to parents for educating their children such as excellent public schools, superior Catholic Schools, exclusive private schools, Charter Schools, and Homeschooling. Many options are available for families to choose from, and we all like to have choices, or at least to know what alternatives exist.

Homeschooling is the smallest of these markets, and has little if any impact on the other models, but it is a growing model. In 1983 there were 100,000 children in homeschooling across the country, by 1990 that number grew to 275,000; in 1997 the number exceeded 1 million. The pre-pandemic number of children in homeschooling is 3.3% of all children, during the pandemic it skyrocketed to 11% and, as of this year, 5.4%. Many home school curriculums were developed by Catholic Schools such as Our Lady of Victory, Seton Home Study School, Kolbe Academy, and Mother of Divine Grace to name but a few. Catholic Home School families make up a small percentage of all children in home-schooling; however they produce 11% of all vocations to the Diocesan priesthood, and 14% of all professed religious.

In every parish I have served, there have been home school families. I have found them to be as well schooled or better, than children in other educational institutions. Homeschooling is challenging for parents, and they need mutual support, and that is the reason for the growth of home school cooperatives.

I have to admit if I were a parent it would not be for me, I would choose a good Catholic School or an excellent public school. But I admire and appreciate the choice of homeschooling. Home school parents have made a big commitment and want to invest in their children like any other parent. I am sorry people like Cardinal McElroy oppose this choice. For the moment good lay people and supportive clergy appreciate and applaud home school families as one educational choice among many, and where it is a good fit. God Bless them!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before

surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.
