Dear Parish Family-



Work is continuing on the roof of the new Church, it began on Thursday, September 21st. The very top of the roof is called "the pyramid" as it is shaped like a pyramid. Each day that weather permits, a section of the pyramid is replaced. Three panels were replaced before the big storm. This week the final sections of the pyramid were replaced. One area of the roof had significant leaks (at the corner of the sacristy); it is one of several "flat" areas of the roof. For many years this area was patched and multiple water tests were performed, even under pressure and under artificial circumstances, no leaks occurred. All of the leaks in the building come from these "flat areas". While they are not truly "flat", they are the flattest areas on a very undulating roof.

These "flat" areas of the roof are at an intersection of the pyramid and the wave sections of the roof. Several years ago an expert we hired told me he thought there was a possibility that the leaks were coming from the pyramid and running down to the flat areas of the roof and down into the interior of the building but, without removing panels, he could not be sure. What has become apparent as sections of the pyramid are replaced is that the majority of the leaks *were* coming from the pyramid. As each section of the metal roof is removed, water stained areas are revealed. The first sections of the pyramid were replaced prior to the hard rain Thursday, September 28-Saturday, September 20, these were directly above the large patch in one of the "flat" areas (at the corner of the sacristy). For the first time *ever*, this area remained dry inside the building; this is the area which has leaked since before the parish occupied the building even before the pews were installed! Finally it is dry! This is a hopeful sign. This coming week the "wave" sections of the lower roof will be removed and replaced.

At the beginning of this re-roofing project, the consultant had planned for the new synthetic rubber roof to have ribs welded to it mimicking the standing seam metal roof. Several issues have arisen regarding the welding of these ribs. It has not been decided yet whether the ribs will be added. The most important goal is a water tight building.

The design for this building comes from a copyrighted plan for an outdoor pavilion designed by Architect and Engineer Daniel Tully. He acted as a consultant to the project and wrote that a standing seam metal roof would not provide water proofing for the building. Standing seam metal roofs create an interesting visual aesthetic and this was the reason it was chosen. A decision was made to accept "form" over "function". Thus, the form looked great but functioned poorly, allowing water into the building. At some point after the building was constructed, and the leaks became intolerable, the standing seam was caulked, which did not hold given the amount of tension created by the near constant movement of the building. In fact, the standing seams began to open from the movement allowing *more* water into the building. The roofer noted that in several areas the seams were wide open.

Temporary patching was done on the roof over the bathrooms where water rushed in during storms. The cause was found to be a section of standing seam metal roof that had been ripped off the building during a storm and cut the membrane. A temporary patch was done as this area is scheduled to be re-roofed as well during this project. There was minimal water penetration, mostly from a different issue, during this last storm.

On Friday, September 29th, the parish welcomed Msgr. Dennis Apoldite, VE to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation on our young men and women of the parish. I was originally scheduled to confirm the candidates, however, I reached out to Msgr. Apoldite and deferred due to the possibility of being chosen to serve on

a Federal Petit Jury. Thankfully, I completed my Jury Service of two weeks and was not chosen, otherwise, I could have been tied up for months. Thank you to Msgr. Apoldite for jumping in to administer the Sacrament.

Yesterday, Saturday Oct. 7th, was the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Two months of the year are dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary; May and October. Last Sunday at the 8:30am Mass, our Parish Rosary -Altar Society ladies processed into the Church before Mass to celebrate Our Lady of the Rosary. The Society corporately attends the 8:30am Mass once a month (when you see the large satin banner with Mary's image on it you know it's the A & R Mass) and have a meeting following the Mass in Morello Hall. All women of the parish are invited and encouraged to join the Society. We had a wonderful day out in July at the Sight and Sound Theatre to see Moses and enjoyed the Shady Maple for lunch. The ladies sponsor various activities throughout the year. They are currently running a trip to the Sight and Sound Theater for Christmas; see the ad in this week's bulletin (page 7) on how to reserve a ticket.

October is also Respect Life Month. Our Holy Father Pope Francis on his recent return flight from his visit to France said, "We cannot play with life... life is not something to be played with. Whether it's the law of not letting the baby grow in the mother's womb or the law of euthanasia in disease or old age, I'm not saying it's an issue of faith. It's a human issue, a human issue. There exists an 'ugly compassion'. Science has come to turn some painful diseases into less painful events, accompanying them with many medicines. But life must not be played with."

The first week of October also saw the Blessing of the Animals on Wednesday, October 4th, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Every year I get the same question about why it is always on Oct. 4th and, that is because that is the Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi, the Patron Saint of Animals! All animals are welcomed but we mostly get dogs and a few cats. In the past I have blessed horses, Irish Wolf Hounds (ok, so they are dogs but as big as miniature ponies!), fancy tailed pigeons, snakes, lizards, hamsters, exotic birds of all sorts, sheep, goats and other variations of God's creatures.

Finally, my companion Chloe passed her tests! The first test was to be certified as a Therapy Dog and the second test was for the American Kennel Club's (AKC) Good Canine Citizen Certificate. She has come a long way from a feral, abused dog to a therapy dog. Training, patience and love can achieve a lot!

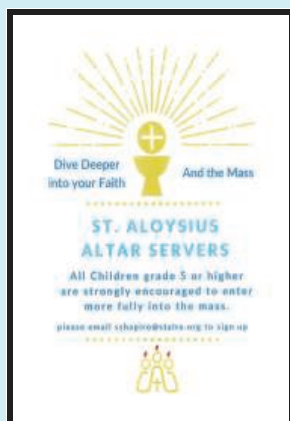
