Dear Parish Family-

The Synod on Synodality continues to unfold in the life of the Church; we have now entered the Continental phase of the Synod which follows the Diocesan Phase. The Diocesan Report essentially matches the reports coming from around our country. The questions, suggestions, issues and challenges appear to be mirrored across the country. From preliminary reports coming from around the world there appears to be a coalescence of issues, at least in the West. The third world has issues that are of different importance.

At the Parish level, the Synod has already born fruit with several initiatives. One of these was actualized last Saturday at the Parish Retreat. This idea came from the Parish Synod Process. Some of the participants in the Parish Synod Process suggested a retreat for women. As the committee formed and met, it developed into an expanded retreat for Small Christian Communities, which in turn developed into a retreat for Ministries of the Parish and came to its final form in the idea of a whole Parish Retreat. This initiative was an organic development that took its final form of an inclusive Parish Retreat open to everyone in the Parish. It was completely planned by a lay committee and led by the same lay committee members who invited the clergy of the parish to participate in specific roles.

The Parish Retreat was a very successful initiative that brought together almost 100 members of the parish for a full day of prayer and reflection, bringing the theory of the Synod into actualized reality. I wish to thank Pam DeRiso, Georgeen Anderson, Nancy Granda, Linda Romaszka, Lynette Yonker and Joanne Couse who served on the Retreat Committee and worked diligently for a successful day for all.

As many of you know I was unable to attend the parish retreat as I tested positive for Covid-19 Omicron variant the day before. Fr. Jim fulfilled his role and my role and gave me a full accounting of the success of the retreat. I had put off getting the Omicron booster too long, Omicron is highly contagious. I had to quarantine for 5 days and start antiviral meds. It has been a long 5 days, not the worst illness I have ever experienced but not a pleasant one either. I am hopefully on the upswing but like those of you who have gone through Covid; it knocks the wind out of your sails!






