Dear Parish Family,

Last week's bulletin message was about St. Francis. We all know that Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, upon election as Supreme Roman Pontiff, took the name Francis in honor of St. Francis of Assisi. The life, witness, teachings, and prayers of St. Francis of Assisi resonated throughout Pope Francis's papacy. Among these was his great Encyclical Letter, a Pope's highest teaching document, which was *Laudato Si*. It took its title from St. Francis's most famous prayer of the same name. The prayer begins, "Praised by my Lord" (*Laudato Si* in Latin).



With this Encyclical, Pope Francis included ecology as one of the pieces of the Church's Social Teachings, thus building on the work of Pope Leo XIII and his predecessors. *Laudato Si* was the first Encyclical letter dedicated to ecology and raising awareness among Christians of God's command at the beginning of Creation, entrusting the first parents and their descendants to be stewards of all God created.

In July, Pope Leo XIV continued Pope Francis' dedication to the care of Creation by instituting the new Liturgical "Mass for Care of Creation," offering Mass at Borgo *Laudato Si*, an educational center at Castel Gondolfo, the summer papal residence. The Mass prayers for the care of Creation place Creation at the heart of the Church's liturgical life, thereby reinforcing the understanding that caring for Creation is a Christian vocation — a vital mission for the Church.

On September 5, Pope Leo returned to Borgo *Laudato Si* to inaugurate the Eco Center for the study and preservation of Creation. There are 135 acres dedicated to offering educational programs for students and professionals who want to learn more about the Catholic theology of care for the environment, as well as events and seminars featuring CEOs of major corporations. The aim is to produce zero waste as part of the land's commitment to sustainability.

Pope Leo said at the inauguration that the Eco Center is "a seed of hope that Pope Francis has left us as a legacy... which will endure by remaining faithful to its mandate: to be a tangible model of thought, structure and action, capable of fostering ecological conversion through education and catechesis."

The Eco Center's land will produce milk, olive oil, wine, honey, and aromatic herbs for teas and oils, which will be sold to support the educational initiatives. Pope Leo spent the day greeting and blessing Andalusian white horses, a newly born calf, and feeding fish in the Koi pond of the little Madonna Garden.

In his homily that day, he spoke about how often Jesus describes nature and Creation in the Gospels, and how the order of nature points to God's divine plan. Among God's creatures, he said, human beings stand out not only as the "most beautiful creature," but also as having the responsibility to safeguard all other creatures. "The care of Creation, then, represents a true vocation for every human being — a task to be carried out within Creation itself, never forgetting that we are creatures among creatures, and not creators."

With these beautiful words, he reminds us that caring for Creation is part of our vocation as Christian disciples of Jesus.
