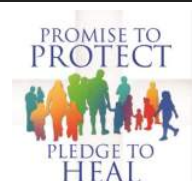

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, the Church throughout the world reminds itself of the parting words of Jesus at the Ascension: “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.” (Matt 28:19-20)



Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved; whoever does not believe will be condemned.” (Mark 16:15—16) “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” (Acts of the Apostles 1:8)

The Lord commissions his Apostles and Disciples to go forth to the ends of the earth, evangelizing, spreading the good news of his message. This remains the central characteristic of the Christian life, the going forth on mission. Our beloved Holy Father Pope Francis never tired of reminding the whole Church that she is missionary and, as such, must always be going forth and never stuck in the “sacristy,” as he put it.

This weekend is World Mission Sunday. The primary motivator of this day is the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, started by Blessed Pauline Jaricot (for those going on the Pilgrimage to France with me, we will be visiting her grave in St. Nizier Church in the city of Lyon). Blessed Pauline Jaricot and Blessed Fredrick Ozanam were both parishioners of this same parish in Lyon, both filled with missionary zeal!

Blessed Pauline Jaricot was a laywoman who founded the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in 1822 to support those working in missionary territories through prayer and small weekly offerings. She simply asked the people of her day to give one penny a week and pray daily for Missionaries who brought the Gospel to the ends of the earth. In 1922, Pope Pius XI made the Society a Pontifical Society for the Whole Church, thus becoming central and essential for fundraising and sustaining the global mission of the Church. In the USA, its most famous Director was Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen.

The Second collection this Sunday supports the formation of seminarians and the formation of sisters and brothers in the mission fields. It pays for the education of children in Catholic Schools in the Missions. It supports healthcare in underserved regions. It trains catechists and lay leaders. It builds churches, chapels, schools, and mission centers in Mission territories. Through our monetary gift, we are not just donating funds but participating in the spiritual and missionary acts of love these donations support. Thus, in this Holy Year of Hope, we bring Christ's hope to the peripheries of the world. Christian hope is not a vague optimism; it is the fruit of divine love, alive in us and active through us. That is why our missionary efforts, our sacrifices, and above all, our proclamation of Christ crucified and risen are powerful acts of hope, especially for communities suffering poverty, violence, or religious persecution.

Pope Leo XIV, who spent a good deal of his priesthood as a missionary in Peru, (even becoming a Peruvian citizen thinking he would live out his days in the Missions of the Church!) said of the Propagation of the Faith that it is the “primary means for awakening missionary responsibility among all the baptized and for supporting ecclesial communities in areas where the Church is young”.

We can recall, as Americans, our own days as a mission territory and the support that the Society for the Propagation of the Faith provided to our churches to grow and mature until 1908, when we became self-sustaining. Now it is our opportunity to help other developing churches globally.

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In his first Apostolic Exhortation given last Thursday, Pope Leo instructs us, *"The Almighty will not be outdone in generosity to those who serve the people most in need: the greater the love for the poor, the greater the reward from God. This Christocentric and deeply ecclesial perspective leads us to affirm that offerings, when born of love, not only alleviate the needs of one's brother or sister, but also purify the heart of the giver, if he or she is willing to change. Indeed, in the words of Pseudo-Augustine: "almsgiving can be beneficial to you in erasing past sins, if you have amended your ways." It is, so to speak, the ordinary path to conversion for those who wish to follow Christ with an undivided heart."*

Please be generous in assisting those who labor and those who receive the gift of those who labor in the name of Christ. Bring hope to those in need in the Missionary territories of the Church this World Mission Sunday. Thank you in advance! I'll let Pope Leo, our countryman, have the final word: *"almsgiving, however modest, brings a touch of pietas into a society otherwise marked by the frenetic pursuit of personal gain. In the words of the Book of Proverbs: "Those who are generous are blessed, for they share their bread with the poor" (22:9).*
