Dear Parish Family,

This weekend marks the Global Catholic Church World Mission Sunday, celebrating and encouraging everyone to have the heart of a missionary. Our support of the men and women, lay people, priests, Religious sisters and brothers, who carry out the boots on the ground mission activity, sends a message of solidarity and commitment to our shared vocation as missionaries of Christ's Church.

The prayers and collection this weekend sustain those of our brothers and sisters working in the 1,150 missionary territories of the world in places like Africa, Asia, Latin America, the Pacific Islands and the Middle East. Our fervent prayers this weekend sustain them, and the funds collected are critical to their success. The funds directly support the formation of priests, religious sisters and catechists, as well as the development of Catholic Schools and healthcare centers for the poor and needy. Our sacrifices and the missionaries commitment are tangible signs of God's love and compassion, providing hope and practical help to the most vulnerable members of our human family here in our common home of the earth that we share with them.

Today's World Mission Sunday Collection is so important to the core of the Christian Message that it is the only Collection mandated by the Code of Canon Law. Pope Francis this year has chosen as the theme for World Mission Sunday, "Go and invite everyone to the banquet." He chose this theme from the Gospel of Matthew 22:9, it calls us to be inspired by the parable of the wedding banquet. The theme calls us to reach out and welcome all to the feast of God's love, echoing the inclusivity and urgency of the King's invitation. Our mission is to reflect this divine hospitality, bringing joy, compassion and hope to everyone we encounter especially in the territories where the Gospel has not yet been received, has been only recently embraced or is courageously upheld in the face of persecution.

Every Christian, by virtue of Baptism and Confirmation, has been commissioned by the Risen Lord on Pentecost Sunday to "Go out to all the world and preach the Gospel". The Missionary activity of the Church is our shared calling. We may not be able to go to Tehran, Kampala, Nablus or one of the other mission areas, but we can each contribute by prayer and financial support our shared responsibility to preach the Gospel. Thank you on behalf of all those hard working men and women who have left the comfort of home and family to be of service to the Risen Lord, the Church and our brothers and sisters in need.

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic "who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age". There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person's illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.

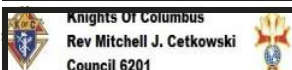

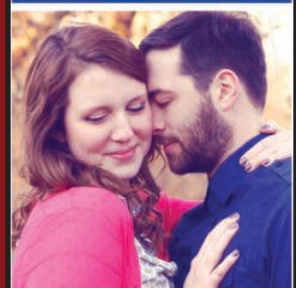
