Dear Parish Family-

Every October the Universal Catholic Church celebrates World Mission Sunday. There are a number of second collections throughout the year for specific missionary activity and every summer our diocese participates in the Missionary Cooperative Plan which aids a single missionary group. These help specific mission societies or activities, but the Missionary Work of the Church is far greater than any of these individual societies.

World Mission Sunday is not just another second collection; it is a day to recognize our participation as a Missionary Church and a Missionary People. Each one of us, from the moment of our baptism, is called to be a Missionary Disciple of Christ. Not all of us are called or capable of serving in the missions of the world, but each of us is called to participate in the missionary work of those who are called and capable through our prayers, support, encouragement and financial sacrifice to assist them in doing the work that is our common calling.

Our Bishop, David M. O'Connell, C.M., a member of a Missionary Order of Priests (The Congregation for the Mission, commonly called 'The Vincentians') wrote to the priests in September about World Mission Sunday, he said, "The World Mission Sunday collection in the United States supports CNEWA (Catholic Near East Welfare Association) aiding Oriental Churches in need with 9% of contributions. It supports the Pontifical Council on Latin America that directs 5% of gifts to aid the poorest jurisdictions in South American and the Caribbean. The balance (86%) supports the Church in those dioceses in Africa and Asia which are designated as mission territories. Last year, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in the United States sent over \$23 million to the bishops, priests, religious brothers and sisters and, lay missionaries who help spread the Gospel in these territories."

The Nuncio to the United States, Cardinal Christophe Pierre, wrote to the US Bishops last year that the American People's support of World Mission Sunday "makes possible the proclamation of the Gospel, the celebration of the Sacraments, and service to the poor in the mission dioceses. For the first decades of its life, the fledgling Church in the United States received essential support from the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, and Catholics of this country have returned that generosity in abundance."

Pope Francis has urged all the baptized to live with "Hearts on fire, feet on the move". He never ceases to remind us we are missionary people always going out, going forth, especially to the peripheries of the world where Christ's love is most needed. Thank you for your support of World Mission Sunday, may our hearts always remain on fire for Jesus and our feet be ever on the move in support of all those who work in rich missionary fields of the world.






Embrace the Pope's Missions with "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move" this World Mission Sunday!



The Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, has also made this request on behalf of the bishops in Israel:

We asked that on Tuesday, October 17, the Feast of St. Ignatius of Antioch, everyone hold a day of fasting, abstinence and prayer. Let us organize prayer times with Eucharistic adoration and with the recitation of the Rosary to Our Blessed Virgin Mary. ... This is the way we all come together despite everything, and unite collectively in prayer, to deliver to God the Father our thirst for peace, justice and reconciliation.
