Dear Parish Family-

Happy World Mission Sunday! The care and promotion of the Missions in each diocese is entrusted to the Office of Missions called "The Society for the Propagation of the Faith", in the Diocese of Trenton this office is headed by Fr. P.J. Alindogan (who is also pastor of St. Veronica in Howell). It is the responsibility of the Mission Office to promote the Missionary activity of the Universal Church in each diocese. They also assign each parish a Missionary to speak each summer through the Missionary Cooperative Plan.

The Society for the Propagation of the Faith was started by a Lay Woman named Blessed Pauline Jaricot who was born in 1799 and founded the society some 200 years ago. She was a deeply religious wealthy aristocratic French-woman. She founded The Society for the Propagation of the Faith to support and pray for the Missions of the Church worldwide. She came upon the idea in a simple way. She started asking her friends to pray and donate one penny a week for the Mission work of the Church. In fact the success of her work is reflected here in the United States where many Churches were built with funds from the Society since America was a Mission Territory until 1908. Pauline Jaricot was so dedicated to the Missionary work of the Church that at the time of her death on January 9, 1862 she was penniless having expended all of her vast resources to the Missions. Her life and vision is one totally dedicated to the work of fulfilling Jesus commission to preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth and spreading the message of hope in the name of Jesus Christ!

Today the Society is formally known as "The Pontifical Mission Societies" since the Pope's gave it their stamp of approval and created Offices within the Vatican Papal Structures to grow and promote the Society world-wide. Today there are Propagation of the Faith Offices in more than 1,100 Dioceses', building churches and healing physical & psychological wounds caused by war, cruelty, oppression, terror and despair.

One hundred and sixty years after her death in May of 2022 in the City of Lyon France where she spent her entire life, the Church declared her "Blessed Pauline Jaricot" for the extraordinary work she promoted, grew and which continues under Papal authority all over the globe.

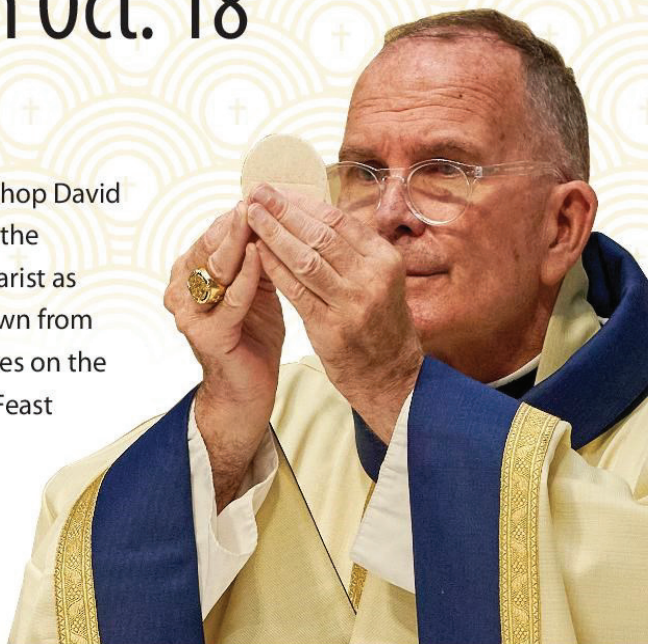
Today we are reminded of the importance of prayer, particularly in the Mass, the Eucharist. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass reminds us that we, who receive Jesus in Holy Communion, are sent into the world to BE witnesses of Jesus Christ and the joy of the Gospel. We are each called by God through Baptism to be Missionaries. Blessed Pauline never left Lyon but effected the promotion of the Gospel as a Missionary without ever leaving Lyon, we are no different than her! She prayed and financially supported the Missions and invited her friends to do the same, that simple act was transformed into a world-wide phenomenon.

Please be generous with your prayers and finances this weekend toward the Missions and those who labor in the Missions!

Bishop O'Connell's series on the Eucharist to launch Oct. 18

In a new five-part series on the Eucharist, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C. M., highlights "many aspects of the inexhaustible gift and mystery of the Holy Eucharist as the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ drawn from Scripture and Tradition." Titled "Catechetical Series on the Eucharist," the segments will begin Oct. 18, the Feast of St. Luke. An installment will drop each week in text, video and podcast across all diocesan digital platforms. **The entire series will be printed in the November issue of The Monitor Magazine.**



The five installments of the series will cover:

Preface and Part One (Oct. 18) • Eucharist as "mystery" and "reality"; faith as a supernatural gift; Jesus' words, "Do this in memory of me," as the institution of the Sacrament of Eucharist

Part Two (Oct. 25) • Catechesis as necessary for belief in the Real Presence of Jesus; Scripture accounts of God's presence among his people

Part Three (Nov. 1) • Excerpts from great theologians, saints, Scripture, emphasizing the unchanging fundamental belief in the Eucharist

Part Four (Nov. 8) • Excerpts from Papal, Vatican II, U.S. Bishop's documents demonstrating continuity and constancy of Eucharistic doctrine

Part Five (Nov. 15) • Eucharistic Lexicon including words, terms and expressions describing or referring to Holy Eucharist or its celebration

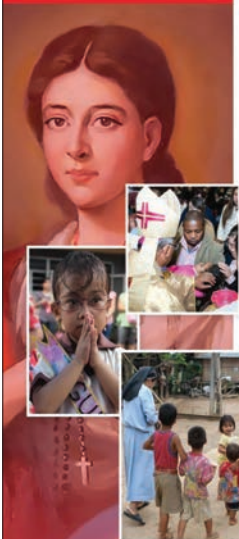
In 1926, Pope Pius XI instituted World Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide World Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927.

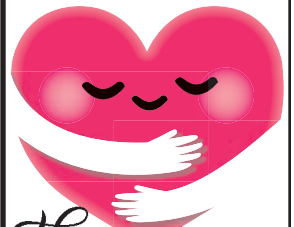
