Dear Parish Family-

On October 10 Pope Francis formally opened the Synod on Synodality, for a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission. On Sunday October 17 Bishop David M. O'Connell opened the Diocesan Phase of the Synod at St. Mary of the Assumption Cathedral in Trenton. I, Fr. Jim and a few parishioners were there.

Bishop O'Connell has appointed Deacon Pat Brannigan, former Executive Director of the New Jersey Catholic Conference and Mary Liz Ivins, former Principal of Notre Dame High School as Co-Chairs of the Diocesan Phase of the Synod Process, they will be assisted by Mrs. Terry Ginther, Diocesan Chancellor. The first organization meeting is scheduled for Oct. 21 and it is anticipated information will come to the parishes some time after this date. A video is being prepared by the Bishop for the Pastors as well.

The Bishops of the New Jersey Catholic Conference met this month in our Diocese and discussed the Synod Process that the Metropolitan Province will follow. The Priests of the Northern Ocean Deanery met this month and had a robust discussion about the Synod.

While plans are still fluid and not officially released it appears each parish will be asked to have listening sessions before March of 2022. The Diocesan Phase closes on April 1, 2022 and the second phase, the National Phase begins.

As we receive information I will be sure to pass it on to you. Pope Francis in his remarks opening the Synod asked us to practice the "Art of Encounter" as we journey together in this process of becoming a "listening" Church where believers "open their hearts" to the Holy Spirit and one another.

The Holy Father said "There is no need to create another church, but to create a different church," drawing on the words of the influential Dominican theologian Fr. Yves Congar. He pleaded with us to "Keep us from becoming a 'museum church,' beautiful but mute, with much past and little future." The Holy Father asked that we be conscious of three "Risks" that he identified as "formalism," "intellectualism," and "the temptation of complacency."

The first risk of formalism he described as “sometimes there is some elitism in the presbyteral order that makes it detached from the laity; and the priest ultimately becomes the ‘master of the house’ and not the shepherd of a whole Church that is moving forward. This requires changing certain overly vertical, distorted and partial visions of the Church, the priestly ministry, the role of the laity, ecclesial responsibilities, roles of governance and so forth.”

The second risk of intellectualism he described as the synod “could turn into a kind of study group,” losing itself in abstraction. “the usual people saying the usual things, without great depth or spiritual insight, and ending up along familiar and unfruitful ideological and partisan divides, far removed from the reality of the holy People of God and the concrete life of communities around the world.”

The third risk of Complacency he described as “We have always done it this way. Those who think this way, perhaps without even realizing it, make the mistake of not taking seriously the times in which we are living. The danger, in the end, is to apply old solutions to new problems. A patch of rough cloth that ends up creating a worse tear. It is important that the synodal process be exactly this: a process of becoming, a process that involves the local Churches, in different phases and from the bottom up, in an exciting and engaging effort that can forge a style of communion and participation directed to mission.”

Bishop David O’Connell has asked the Pastors to distribute the Synod Prayer to be prayed through the end of the Synod in 2023. The Prayer was prayed at the Vatican II and was adapted from a longer prayer composed by St. Isidore of Seville. I have included the prayer in this letter and we will have it printed and in the pews to pray before all Masses, meetings, celebrations in the Parish. I invite all group and ministry leaders to open all meetings and gatherings with this prayer for the next few years.

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen!
