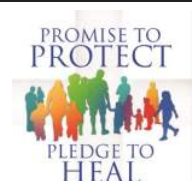

Dear Parish Family,

Last month, one of the Italian papers ran a headline that sounded at first glance to be either satirical or misleading: "Catholic Church declares Satanic Priest a Saint". But in fact, it was more or less a true statement; you would have to read the article to find out. Last Sunday, World Mission Sunday, Pope Leo XIV canonized seven new saints. Among them was Blessed Bartolo Longo, now Saint Bartolo Longo. For those who joined me on the Pilgrimage of Hope to Rome, you may recall that we had Mass in the Chapel where the altar is glass and contained his relics.

Bartolo Longo was born in Brindisi, Italy. At the age of 10, his mother died. He attended the University of Naples Law School during a time when there was anti-Catholic sentiment, and his professors were mostly of this bent. He tells us they hated priests, "I, too, grew to hate monks, priests, and the pope ...and in particular I detested the Dominicans, the most formidable, furious opponents of those great modern professors, proclaimed by the university sons of progress, the defenders of science, champions of every sort of freedom."

Popular at the time in Naples were all manner of the Occult, which Bartolo began to dabble in and eventually became a consecrated priest of Satan, promising his soul to the devil and preaching boldly and blasphemously against God and the Church.

A solid Catholic Professor, Vincenzo Pepe, began to meet with Bartolo, eventually directing him to speak with a Dominican Friar. After lengthy conversations, he chose to return to the Church on the Feast of the Sacred Heart in 1865. He said that it was due to his praying the Rosary. He mentioned he had closed his heart to God, but the door of his heart was cracked open a bit to the Virgin Mary. By praying the Rosary, Mary slipped into his heart and brought him back to God our Father!

He tells us, "One day in the fields around Pompeii I recalled my former condition as a priest of Satan...I thought that perhaps the priesthood of Christ is for eternity, so also the priesthood of Satan is for eternity. So, despite my repentance, I thought: I am still consecrated to Satan, and I am still his slave and property as he awaits me in Hell. As I pondered over my condition, I experienced a deep sense of despair and almost committed suicide. Then I heard an echo in my ear of the voice of Friar Alberto repeating the words of the Blessed Virgin Mary: 'One who propagates my Rosary shall be saved'. Falling to my knees, I exclaimed: 'If your words are true that he who propagates your Rosary will be saved, I shall reach salvation because I shall not leave this earth without propagating your Rosary.

And so in the ruins of the City of Pompeii, he began the propagation of the Rosary, building the great Basilica of Our Lady of Pompeii of the Rosary. But not only praying and promoting the Rosary but also living out the mysteries of the Rosary by building many charitable works in health, education and economics for the impoverished people living in and around Pompeii. He became a friend of Pope Leo XIII. His work on the Rosary and the Virgin Mary helped to bring about the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception.

He married Marianna Farnararo, the Countess di Fusco, in 1885. She, too, was devoted to the Virgin Mary and the Rosary. Together, they propagated the Rosary and devotion to the Blessed Mother, living in voluntary chastity. They declared their marriage a "Josephite Marriage" meaning they lived as brother and sister, dedicated to Spiritual and Charitable works.

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His writings on the Rosary inspired Saint Pope John Paul II to introduce the Luminous Mysteries to the Rosary. St. John Paul gave Bartolo Longo the title "Apostle of the Rosary" and beatified him on Oct. 26, 1980, in Rome.

After spending decades promoting the Rosary and doing long hours of charity, he passed to eternal life on October 5, 1926, at the age of 85. It is fitting that his canonization takes place in October, the Month of the Most Holy Rosary. His conversion and life remind us of the power of the Most Holy Rosary and the Intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

BOOK OF NAMES — This special book is available in the Gathering Space of the Church for the faithful to write the names of loved ones who have died. These names can include relatives, friends, co-workers, neighbors, or anyone you wish to remember.

The Book of Names, along with collection envelopes for All Souls' Day, will remain in the Church for the month of November by Our Lady of Tenderness

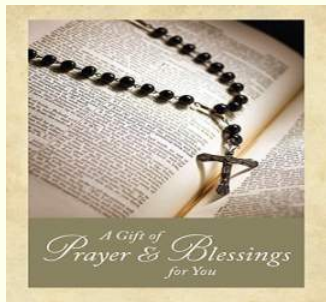

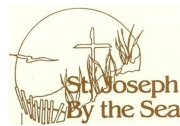

All communication will be confidential.

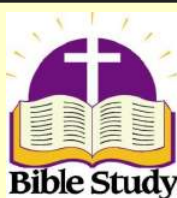
