Dear Parish Family,



This Friday is the Solemn Holy Day of Obligation for All Saints. The Code of Canon Law of the Latin Church states; "On Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation the faithful are bound to participate in Mass" (CC: 1247). The Mass schedule for All Saints is the following: Vigil Mass on Thursday October 31st at 5pm. On November 1st Mass times are: 8:30am and 12 Noon. The following day is the feast of All Souls' (neither a Solemnity nor day of obligation). Our Mass of Remembrance is Saturday, November 2nd at 8:30am, with a Pancake Breakfast in Morello Hall afterwards, compliments of the Knights of Columbus. All are welcome.

Speaking of Holy Days of Obligation, next month is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation. Normally this feast is held on December 8th every year; however this year, December 8th, is the 2nd Sunday of Advent. The Office of Worship for the Diocese informed us that the Holy See has moved this feast to Monday, December 9th this year due to it falling on a Sunday during the Holy Season of Advent. Mass times are Monday, Dec. 9th at 8:30am, 12noon and 6pm.

In the life of the Church there are numerous liturgical celebrations recalling events in the life of Jesus Christ, the Blessed Mother of the Lord, and various saints, their importance is one of gradation. The highest are Solemnities of Obligation (Holy Days of Obligation), then Solemnities (high feasts but without obligation) then major memorials followed by minor memorials.

In the Universal Catholic Church, every Sunday is a primary Holy Day of Obligation. The other Solemn Holy Days of Obligation in the Universal Church are: Christmas (December 25), Epiphany (January 6), Ascension (Thursday of the 6th week of Easter), Corpus Christi (Thursday after Trinity Sunday), Holy Mary Mother of God (January 1), Immaculate Conception (December 8), Assumption of the Virgin (August 15), St. Joseph Husband of Mary (March 19), Saints Peter and Paul (June 29) and All Saints (November 1).

By now you have figured out that some of those Solemn Holy Days of Obligation are not celebrated here in the USA (SS. Peter & Paul and St. Joseph), and others are celebrated on Sundays in the USA (Epiphany, Ascension, Corpus Christi). This is because the Code of Canon Law of the Latin Church allows National Bishops' Conferences to petition the Holy See for exceptions. In the USA the Solemnities of St. Joseph and SS. Peter and Paul are not of obligation but still celebrated liturgically while Epiphany, Ascension and Corpus Christi have been permanently transferred to Sundays.

Here in the USA, we only observe Christmas, Mary Mother of God, Immaculate Conception, Assumption and All Saints. With one exception, should Mary Mother of God, Assumption, or All Saints fall on a Saturday or a Monday, they are no longer days of obligation. The Holy See has directed that Immaculate Conception should remain a day of obligation because it is the National Feast for the USA, as well as for the Universal Church and Christmas, regardless of the day it falls on, and always remains a day of obligation.

A Bishop may dispense his entire Diocese from a day of obligation for a good cause, and a Pastor may dispense an individual parish member from his parish for a good cause. Thus, when someone knows they will be away, say on vacation or be on a cruise, and not able to find a Church, they can request from their Pastor a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on a Sunday, or Holy Day of Obligation, and not incur the pain of committing a Mortal Sin.

The Church also teaches that no one is obligated to the impossible. For example, I am on my way to Mass and there is a terrible accident which requires my direct assistance; stopping and assisting would mean I would miss Mass, and there are no other Masses available to me. I can stop, help the injured, and not incur a mortal sin. Or, I am visiting a remote area and there are no Catholic Churches, I do not incur a mortal sin for missing Mass because there are no Masses for me to attend. There are other examples, but suffice it to say one is never obligated to the impossible. Attending Mass via live stream does not relieve one of the obligation to physically be present at Mass, unless you are sick or homebound, not because I just don't feel like getting in the car, I overslept, have a bridge game, don't like the time schedule or, whatever. While we are obligated under pain of Mortal Sin to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation, I would hope every Christian would gladly and joyfully want to come to the House of the Lord and offer him fitting praise and worship as the primary reason for coming. Remember, God loves a cheerful giver not a dour soul!

In the Catholic Church, the anointing of the sick is a sacrament that is administered to a Catholic “who, having reached the age of reason, begins to be in danger due to sickness or old age”. There is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament. The Sacrament may be received at any time during a person’s illness, especially before surgery or treatment. We suggest calling to receive the Sacrament *before* a person is in grave danger of death as it is not always possible to have a priest available at the actual time of death. If you would like to schedule the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for a loved one, please contact the parish office.

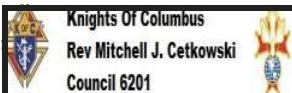
