I also expressed how we must open ourselves to the movement of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit that is always one of surprises, that never fails to guide our pilgrim way and in whom we must place our trust. The Holy Spirit will never lead us astray.

One thing we must all do as faithful members of Christ Church is pray for the success of the Synod. The official prayer will be prayed before Masses, I invite a groups in the parish to pray it before the start of their events and I ask every person to pray this prayer daily for the success of the Synod. George Hassler of Hassler Funeral Home graciously printed the prayer with the Synod Logo and it is available in Church.
