Dear Parish Family,

This Tuesday, November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. There will be an anticipatory Mass on Monday, October 31st at 6pm. On Tuesday, Masses will be at 8:30am, 12noon and 5pm.

Wednesday, November 2nd is the Feast of All Souls and Mass will be at 8:30am with the names of all those who died from last All Souls to present announced and prayed for on that day. Additionally, their names will be in a Book of Remembrance placed in front of the Icon of Our Lady of Tenderness for the Month of November along with the All Souls Envelopes on which you have written the names of your loved ones.

Our Holy Father Pope Francis made a surprise announcement on Sunday Oct. 16th; he loves to make surprise announcements! He announced his intention to break the Synod on Synodality: Participation, Communion and Mission. The Holy Father said, "In order to provide more time for extended discernment, I have established that this Synodal Assembly will take place in two sessions: The first on 4-29 October 2023 and the second on October 2024", his stated reason was that he hoped it will "Favor the comprehension of synodality as a constitutive element of the Church, and help everyone to live it as a journey of brothers and sisters who bear witness to the joy of the Gospel."

His decision to give the Synodal process more time for discernment is key to bringing about a fruitful result for the whole Church. In his homily on October 11, 2022, marking the 60th Anniversary of Vatican Council II, he asked everyone to re-orient themselves for this journey of Synodality, he said, "The Church needs first to be viewed from on high, with God's eyes, eyes full of love. Let us ask ourselves if we, in the Church, start with God and his loving gaze upon us. We are always tempted to start from ourselves rather than from God, to put our own agendas before the Gospel, to let ourselves be caught up in the winds of worldliness in order to chase after the fashions of the moment or to turn our back on the time that Providence has granted us, in order to retrace our steps."


The Holy See press office noted that taking the Synod from one year to two years lengthens the period of serious discernment the Parish, Diocesan, Continental and World Wide listening sessions have produced. The Synodal Process began in 2021 with feedback from 112 out of 114 Bishop's Conferences about the listening sessions that took place in individual parishes and diocese. The Holy Father's decision to extend the period of discernment means that in reality we must see the method and the process as more important than the individual themes themselves which have emerged and need to be addressed.

The world-wide consultations have generally tracked the same, about a 1% response rate across the globe. In the USA the response rate was 1% of the total Catholic Population participating in some way; either in person, a virtual session or by survey. While this was a very low response to the Holy Father's invitation to every baptized Catholic, it still represents a large number of people and a huge undertaking. All the parish and diocesan listening session consultations have been collated by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and are now part of the Continental Phase discussions of the Synod which will be submitted to Rome for the first Synod of Bishop's Meeting in October of 2023.

Peace and Good – Fr. Bambrick

Bishop O'Connell's series on the Eucharist to launch Oct. 18

In a new five-part series on the Eucharist, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C. M., highlights "many aspects of the inexhaustible gift and mystery of the Holy Eucharist as the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus Christ drawn from Scripture and Tradition." Titled "Catechetical Series on the Eucharist," the segments will begin Oct. 18, the Feast of St. Luke. An installment will drop each week in text, video and podcast across all diocesan digital platforms. **The entire series will be printed in the November issue of The Monitor Magazine.**



The five installments of the series will cover:

Preface and Part One (Oct. 18) • Eucharist as "mystery" and "reality"; faith as a supernatural gift; Jesus' words, "Do this in memory of me," as the institution of the Sacrament of Eucharist

Part Two (Oct. 25) • Catechesis as necessary for belief in the Real Presence of Jesus; Scripture accounts of God's presence among his people

Part Three (Nov. 1) • Excerpts from great theologians, saints, Scripture, emphasizing the unchanging fundamental belief in the Eucharist

Part Four (Nov. 8) • Excerpts from Papal, Vatican II, U.S. Bishop's documents demonstrating continuity and constancy of Eucharistic doctrine

Part Five (Nov. 15) • Eucharistic Lexicon including words, terms and expressions describing or referring to Holy Eucharist or its celebration

The "Catechetical Series on the Eucharist" will be available in text, video and podcast (English and Spanish) and can be accessed at DioceseofTrenton.org/eucharist-series or by scanning the QR code.
